Management Committee's responsibilities

The Management Committee are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In accordance with s.385 of the Companies Act 1985, a resolution for the re-appointment of Dick Maule as auditor is to be proposed at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are being written off over the expected useful life of the asset, using the straight line basis at 25% per annum. In the case of donated assets an amount equal to depreciation is credited to General Reserves.

Value Added Tax

Income and expenditure in the accounts is expressed inclusive of V.A.T..
