The principle activities of the company are to promote education and training in the creative and expressive arts and media of every description, and to advance the spiritual educational physical cultural and social welfare of young people and in particular those living in inner city areas

The Board revisited its previous analysis of the major risks that could affect the charity's operations. We continued to work through our action plan to address the risks that seemed most serious and most likely.

Raw Material

- Nurturing some of London's best and most happening original talent in music and media

The fundamental vision of Raw Material remains as:

A vision that sees the arts and creativity as a central theme in community cohesion, personal and professional development and enabling contributions to be made collectively to creating better societies, based on human rights, shared needs, common aims and principles with achievable outcomes Raw Material has the vision to see young people working in the arts developing positivity, thriving, succeeding and contributing to their communities

And the mission remains as:

Raw Material's mission is to empower and enable, by providing high quality art experiences, development and professional outcomes for emerging young artists, in particular from the Black and minority ethnic community, in inner city areas that experience social economic deprivation and exclusion, and to provide a professional world class platform for the presentation of new work and the development of new audiences

Raw Material is proud of its achievements over the last 10 years and in particular over the last year following the financial difficulties of 2008-9. These could not have been achieved without the investment by ACE, LB Lambeth and our many funders in the premises and programmes in Brixton. The premises, and the facilities provided, have proved a valuable resource to both the immediate community in Brixton, but also as part of joint venture activities with other like-minded organisations. We believe that Raw Material has, and will continue, to play an important and fundamental role in this aspiration.

Raw Material has identified the need to strengthen existing practices through the ongoing restructuring of Raw Material, identifying options available to the organisation and by investigating the possibilities of partnership approaches in order to increase capacity, quality and reach

During the year, we worked with 350 young people and delivered almost 28,000 hours of activities, as recorded through the monitoring statistics sent quarterly to LB Lambeth Some of the activities were accredited through Trinity Guildhall Arts Award Bronze and Silver levels and these were awarded to 20 young people

The programme has been supported by the Arts Council England, London Borough of Lambeth Arts, Lambeth Education, Evan Cornish Foundation, BBC Children in Need, the Youth Justice Board, First Light Movies, the City Parochial Foundation/ Trust for London, and contributions from Connexions and Streetleague,

The 2009-10 programme

The artistic programme had five main areas of activity

- Arts and education programme
- Music and artist development
- Live music and touring
- Film production
- International programme

The following activities took place:

Academy Options - funded by Lambeth schools, this was a year-long arts education and engagement programme for young people at risk of exclusion, covering music photography and performance work, Arts Award accredited

Academy music 'Raw Essence' - live music workshops 4 hours weekly for 45 weeks for 10 young musicians and singers to develop, produce, rehearse and perform their own original music. This project has enabled the participants to develop new skills in music and singing and they performed at 11 live events during the year, including events at Lambeth Country Show 'Cultivate' Stage and Hackney Empire. They have now progressed to a semi professional level and they have recorded two mini albums (6 track EP's). This project was supported by volunteers and a music mentor.

Work with venues

We continued working with both existing and in developing relationships with London venues, developing work with the aim to present cross art form work in accessible venues and drawing diverse audiences from across the London region with

The Fridge, Jamm, The Ritzy, Hackney Empire, Bar Changa, Southbank centre and the BFI, Cultivate stage - Lambeth Country Show, Charlotte Street Blues, Leonard St Gallery, Black Rat Press Gallery

A series of live music and mixed media events have taken place from May - December 2009, at the Ritzy cinema, at the Black Rat Press gallery and two events at the Lambeth Country Show "Cultivate" stage) and a further six live music events took place culminating in two events at Hackney Empire, one of which was filmed by the BBC as part of a documentary of young people leaving care A further event took place at the Charlotte Street Blues in the West End in February 2010

Raw Mix and Raw Essence recording projects

Young people worked with our in house producer over 10 weeks on recording an album of their music work 10 young artists were involved in recording, mixing and mastering this CD called *Raw Mix*, a combination of hiphop, grime and Rn'B music

Summer Arts College - run in association with the local Youth Offending Team, this project offered 10 young "tagged" offenders the opportunity to participate in a music and photography course full time over five weeks. The group all achieved an Arts Award bronze level and presented their work at an event at Lambeth Town Hall attended by the mayor of Lambeth (additional funding from funded from Youth Justice Board)

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (continued) YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

First Light Movies studio award

This was a one year documentary film production project, comprising workshops and production on weekends, holidays and evenings. This project involved developing ideas and producing four short documentaries about issues affecting youth, which covered teenage depression, crime, health and confidence and personal safety. The work in progress was screened at the Ritzy in Brixton in 2009 ('Raw Essence') and some participants progressed to be involved in the 'Raw Flix' hub project that took place in April 2010 with the BFI 'Future Film' programme. This project has helped the participants to progress to FE college courses in performing arts and media

Raw Media – this was run in association with Connexions Prospects employment services 6 - 9 hours per month to engage and motivate NEET young people in Lambeth This project offered music, photography and video linked to drama and life skills. The 80 participants we worked with during the year (10 per session) received additional mentoring and career support advice and guidance from Connexions over two weeks to help them find progression routes to college or employment (additional funding from Connexions)

Goals - this was a film based project run in association with Streetleague, which provided a five week programme for NEET young people, that links arts and football with personal development, life skills and career guidance

Raw Material provided three four day film projects where a total of 45 participants (15 per project) made two short films on each project, a total of nine films devised, filmed and produced by the participants. The results were then screened at the FA in London (additional funding from Streetleague)

Raw Hub - three 10 day projects took place during the year attended by 25 people. This project was an up skilling opportunity for unemployed young people to develop design and business skills for the creative industry sector. Participants produced music in the studio and then the associated packaging, branding, logos and letterheads for their prospective business ideas.

Academy - Community access Throughout the year, Raw Material provided 6 hours per week open access sessions for all young people who were attending the Academy and associated projects to access the facilities on a booking basis - for music studio sessions, internet access and general IT

KAAF- International programme

We ran a week long film making programme for KAAF, the KwaZulu African film festival in Kwamashu South Africa, delivering photography and documentary film making course and production project, the results of which were screened at the festival. We continued working with the Afro Manding drummers in the Gambia, supporting their development and profile through the 2008 recording work, redesigning and printing the album

Local Area Agreement

Raw Material worked during the year with LB Lambeth's Local Area Agreement, (LAA) that prioritised work with young people under 19. Through this programme we were able to achieve a significant number of outcomes and contributed to the overall strategic aims of providing better opportunities for excluded young people, to regeneration and sustainable and cohesive communities.

Lambeth Creative Action Partners

We worked closely with Lambeth's Creative Action Partners, a group of arts, education and community organisations that work with young people and seek to provide cohesive and proactive approaches to work with young people in south London and to promote the sector and provide advocacy and support Overall, this partnership achieved an overall success rate in Lambeth that exceeded the expectations of the LAA

Our view of the artistic quality of the work produced and how this was assessed

From our evaluation, feedback and participant tracking we can report that the participants have been able to use the experience, new skills and evidence of their projects and the accreditation to progress to further education and in some cases employment. Participation in the projects has enabled young people to gain new skills, confidence and self esteem and it has contributed in general to community cohesion, improved community dialogue and positive and diversionary activities and positive attitudes in young people.

Outcomes

The following outcomes were achieved during the year

- 28,000 hrs of activities were provided
- 9 short films were produced
- 2 music album projects were produced
- 11 cross art form and live music performance events were presented
- 350 young people participated in the programmes
- 15 gained Bronze level Arts awards
- 5 gained Silver Arts awards
- 100 progressed to Further education
- 30 gained employment
- 30 are continuing with courses at Raw Material
- 15 are working as semi professional musicians and singers
- 2 are continuing as youth peer mentors
- 3 are involved in youth steering groups (BFI) and on Board student representation at Raw Material

Particular successes, challenges and lessons learned in 2009/10 and how these will inform our future planning

Raw Material has been through a period of development over the last three years that saw a number of adventurous and ambitious new initiatives linked to professional development in a number of areas, across club events, a record label, international work in three countries, film and a youth arts academy

It became clear in mid 2008 that the capacity to maintain this level of activity and investment was beyond the means of the company. Income was down, fund raising had not been successful, costs had increased and it was therefore decided to draw a line in October 2008 and re define the activities and future, taking a fresh view and a more pragmatic approach.

Following discussions with our senior management, the board and suggestions from ACE music department, we identified the need to strengthen existing practices through restructuring Raw Material, identify options available to the organisation and to investigate the possibilities of a partnership approaches in order to increase capacity, quality and reach

In 2010-11 Raw Material is continuing to develop new programmes and the ACE and other funding has made a great contribution to keeping these opportunities open and accessible to people from excluded and disadvantaged communities, where there are limited if not non-existent opportunities and resources. In a climate of cuts and financial downturn this has proved invaluable

2011 will bring major challenges for the third sector and for the arts and inclusion, where cuts are anticipated and Raw Material is unsure whether it will receive any support from the Arts Council of England, which is the major funding source which keeps the building running

Key developments for the organisation

Governance

Raw Material recruited 10 new people to an advisory Board who participated in the restructuring process. Through outside commitments the advisory Board went down to six people of whom three became Trustees.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (continued) YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

Management structure

The management structure was revised and new systems implemented for the management and supervision of the programme delivery team. The charity director and Programme director continued to work closely with the Board throughout this process with the consultant and advisors.

Encouraging attendance and participation

Marketing and promoting of the programme was achieved through links with websites, through the London What's Up distribution network. The Raw Essence live music touring project built up audiences across London. As was found in the monitoring data provided by LB Lambeth, high levels of participation were achieved which met the Local Area Agreement targets (28,000 hours)

Public Benefit Reporting

The trustees have taken account of the statutory reporting duty introduced in 2009 to illustrate how in practice the activities of Raw Material meet the legal public benefit requirement. In this respect, the trustees have noted and paid due regard to all the Charity Commission's statutory guidance that is relevant to our mission, and have highlighted in this report examples of Raw Material's activities which illustrate how our work fulfils its mission and the significant benefits it brings to individuals and communities in poverty areas, irrespective of their race, religion or creed

Developments in relation to issues identified in previous reports

Following the difficulties experienced in late 2008 with finance, staffing and programme, new structures were put in place by the director and Board for financial management, staffing and the artistic programme

A revised artistic programme was put in place for April 2009, following management recommendations and financial considerations. This did not affect quality but the artistic direction was amended accordingly to address the issues that had caused the difficulties in late 2008/9. The financial situation and deficit was addressed and resolved and the account was put in credit.

Restructuring programme

Funded by ACE Grants for the Arts award, the restructuring period in 2009 involved Raw Material management, Board and a consultant. The aim was to explore a series of options being a merger with another organisation, "staying as is" or selling the premises and relocating and to restructure the organisation accordingly. The final decision was taken to "stay as is" and to overhaul the organisation, programme, staff and finance, which were successfully carried out during the year

2010/11 funding year and beyond

Raw Material has successfully restructured and re established itself during 2009-10, and moves into 2010-11 with a new Board, staff team and aspirations

The artistic programme has developed and new and exciting partnerships are being developed across the sector, from voluntary community groups to residencies at the BFI Southbank centre. The charities finance has been stabilised and reserves built up. However, the main issue is the uncertainty over the ACE subsidy from 2012, which would impact on the ability of Raw Material to continue and maintain the Brixton building. These matters are currently being dealt with and plans drawn up for the future of the organisation.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005, applicable UK Accounting Standards, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Companies Act 2006

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small

Incoming resources

Voluntary income including donations, gifts and legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of general nature are recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability. Such income is only deferred when

- The donor specifies that the grant or donation must only be used in future accounting periods, or
- The donor has imposed conditions which must be met before the charity has unconditional entitlement

Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Resources expended are allocated to the particular activity where the cost relates directly to that activity

Accumulated funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the management committee for particular purposes

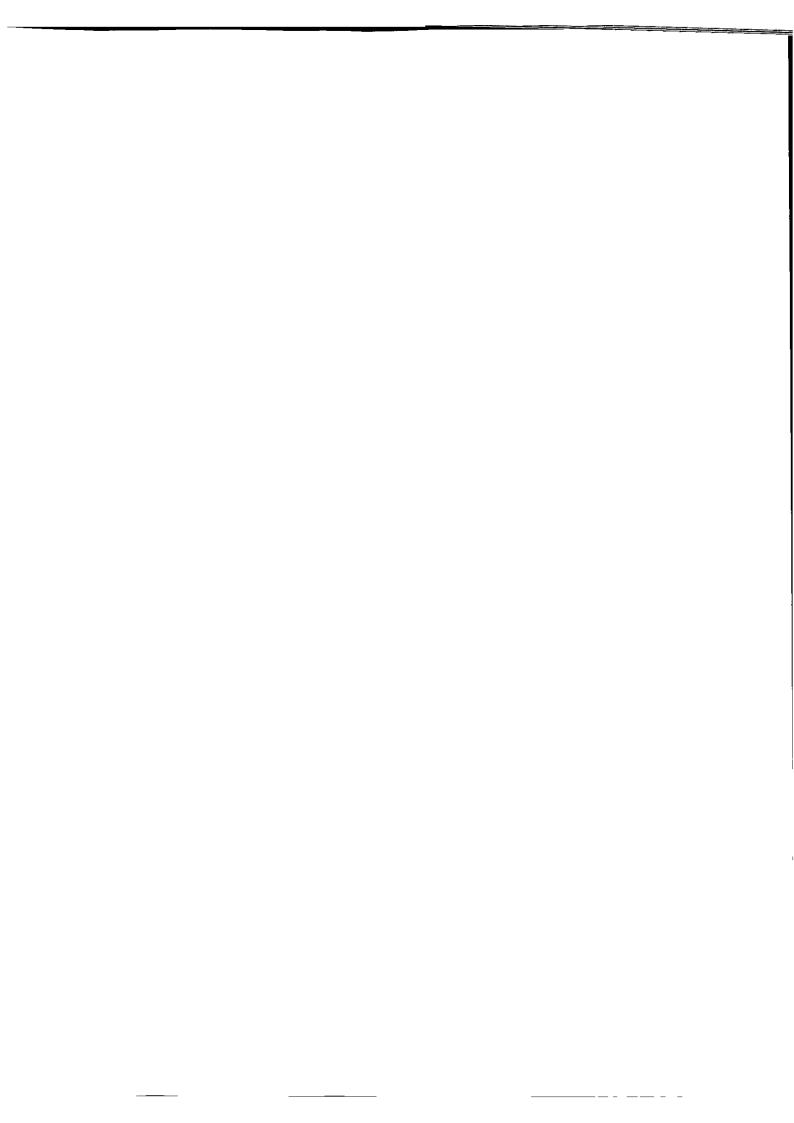
