The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 30 September 2006

Statement of directors' responsibilities

The directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements,
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business,

Principal Activities

The principal activity of the company throughout the year was that of market research

Review of Business

We aim to present a balanced and comprehensive review of the development and performance of our business during the year and its position at the year end. Our review is consistent with the size and non-complex nature of our business and is written in the context of the risks and uncertainties we face

BMG Research was established in 1988 and serves both the social public sector and the commercial private sector, providing market and customer intelligence which is vital in the development of plans, the support of campaigns and the evaluation of performance

Whilst turnover has not increased during the current financial year, with turnover falling slightly from £7,660,396 to £6,989,457, the company is anticipating a significant increase in turnover for the year to September 2007, with a healthy increase in gross margin and a return to the company's previous levels of profitability.

DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2006 (CONT)

Although turnover has not increased during the year, the company has developed the customer base and has generated sales from new business

Staffing levels in 2005 were 219 increasing to 233 at the end of 2006. The increased staffing levels demonstrate the investment in people and in business development and have been planned to enable the company to meet the high levels of demand during 2007.

As for many businesses of our size, the business environment in which we operate continues to be competitive. However, as a company we have invested in product development and thus strengthened our position as one of the major sources of UK social and market intelligence.

With these risks and uncertainties in mind, we are aware that any plans for future expansion and development of the business may be subject to unforeseen future events outside of our control. Necessary adjustments and investment will be made to counteract any adverse business developments wherever possible.

Future Developments

The directors believe that the prospects for continued growth are good and that the company is well placed to take advantage of market opportunities as they arise

Results and Dividends

The results of the year's trading and the financial position of the company are shown in the annexed accounts. The company's loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to £8,917 (2005 - profit £398,740). The directors also recommend that the interim dividend of £113,333 paid in respect of the redeemable shares be confirmed.

Acquisition of own shares

During the year the company acquired 2,838 of its ordinary share capital. This represented 1% of the company's called up share capital and the shares were purchased for £35,986. The acquisition was at the request of a resigning director and the shares were cancelled after the purchase.

During the year the company issued 42,838 Ip redeemable shares The shares were fully paid

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below and have remained unchanged from the previous year, and also have been consistently applied

Consolidation

The parent company and its subsidiary undertakings comprise a medium sized group. The company has therefore taken advantage of the exemption provided by Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare group accounts

Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention

The effect of events in relation to the year ended 30 September 2006 which occurred before the date of approval of the financial statements by the Board of Directors, have been included in the statements to the extent required to show a true and fair view of the state of affairs at 30 September 2006 and of the results for the year ended on that date

Depreciation

Depreciation has been computed to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives using the following rates

Computer equipment Fixtures and fittings

- 33% per annum of cost
- 20% per annum of cost

Deferred Taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounts purposes and their treatment for tax purposes. Tax deferred or accelerated is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences.

Research and Development

Expenditure on research and development is written off against profits for the year in which it is incurred

Leasing

Tangible fixed assets acquired under finance leases or hire purchase contracts are capitalised and depreciated in the same manner as other tangible fixed assets. The related obligations, net of future finance charges, are included in creditors

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Pension Costs

The company operates a pension scheme for the benefit of certain directors and employees The scheme is a defined contribution scheme, and the contributions are charged against profits as they are paid

Revenue Recognition

All income is project related and revenue is recognised incrementally as work progresses on each project. All costs directly attributable to each project are charged against profits as they are incurred.

The company s turnover represents the value, excluding Value Added Tax, of goods and services supplied to customers during the year
