The directors present their report and audited accounts for the year ended 31 March 2012

Principal activity

The company was previously the holding company of Johnson Matthey Ceramics Overseas Limited which it sold on 28 February 2007

Results and dividends

The company's profit for the year ended 31 March 2012 is £1,721,000 (2011 £1,069,000) The profit and loss account is set out on page 3 The directors recommend the payment of a final ordinary dividend of £1,721,000 for the year ended 31 March 2012 which will be paid during the year ending 31 March 2013 (2011 £1,087,000)

Responsibility of the directors for preparation of the directors' report and the accounts


The directors are responsible for preparing the directors' report and the accounts in accordance with applicable law and regulations



Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards under the historical cost convention

Basis of preparation

The company is exempt from the requirement of Financial Reporting Standard (FRS) 1 (Revised) – “Cash Flow Statements” to present a cash flow statement because it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Johnson Matthey Plc which prepares consolidated accounts that are publicly available (note 9)
