STATEMENT AS TO DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION TO AUDITORS



**REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF

We have audited the financial statements of Home Depot (U.K.) Limited for the year ended 31 December 2013 on pages four to eight. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of: whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed; the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the directors; and the overall presentation of the financial statements. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**Accounting convention**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards.

Cash flow statement

The company have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a subsidiary undertaking where more than 90% of the voting rights are controlled within the group.

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for services from other entities in the Home Depot group and relates to services provided in Europe.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into Euros at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into Euros at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Going concern

The company is reliant on the continued financial support of its' parent undertaking The Home Depot Inc, to whom a loan totalling €300,282 (2012 - €307,325) is due at 31 December 2013.

As there is no formal agreement in place the loan has been classified in the accounts as due within one year. However, the directors are not intending to demand repayment of the loan until the company is in a position to do so. This facility will remain in place for the foreseeable future and on this basis the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

Currency

The Accounts have been prepared in Euros as this is the main operating currency of the company.

2. TURNOVER

The turnover and profit before taxation are attributable to the one principal activity of the company.
