#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### **YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017**

#### 1. General information

The company is a private company limited by shares and is incorporated in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Westminster House, 10 Westminster Road, Macclesfield, Cheshire, SK10 1BX. The principal activity of the company continued to be that of motor vehicle sales, motor vehicle servicing, motor vehicle repairs and motor vehicle parts sales.

#### 2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Section 1A of FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland'.

#### 3. Accounting policies

#### **Basis of preparation**

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through profit or loss.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

#### Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis which assumes that the company will continue to trade for the foreseeable future, and continue to receive the support from the company directors.

## Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

#### Significant judgements

The judgements (apart from those involving estimations) that management has made in the process of applying the entity's accounting policies and that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements are as follows:

The year end carrying value of stock at the year end is reviewed in accordance with their expected selling value at the year end. Demonstrator models generally are written down by 2% each month unless use would require a more appropriate percentage. Used cars are reviewed against CAP (current auction price) values to ensure their carrying values are reliable.

#### Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty (continued)

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

Accounting estimates and assumptions are made concerning the future and, by their nature, will rarely equal the related actual outcome. The key assumptions and other sources of estimation uncertainty that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are as described below.

As described in the accounting policies of the financial statements, depreciation of tangible fixed assets has been based on estimated useful lives and residual values deemed appropriate by the directors. Estimated useful lives and residual lives are reviewed annually and revised as appropriate. Revisions take in to account actual asset lives and residual values as evidence by disposals during current and prior accounting periods.

#### Revenue recognition

Turnover represents the total invoice value, excluding value added tax, of sales made during the year, together with commissions and bonuses received as a direct consequence of the invoiced amounts.

Revenue is recognised in the period in which the work is completed.

#### Corporation tax

The taxation expense represents the aggregate amount of current and deferred tax recognised in the reporting period. Tax is recognised in profit or loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case, tax is recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, respectively.

Current tax is recognised on taxable profit for the current and past periods. Current tax is measured at the amounts of tax expected to pay or recover using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences at the reporting date. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

#### Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

#### Tangible assets (continued)

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation, is recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in equity, except to the extent it reverses a revaluation decrease of the same asset previously recognised in profit or loss. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation, is recognised in other comprehensive income to the extent of any previously recognised revaluation increase accumulated in equity in respect of that asset. Where a revaluation decrease exceeds the accumulated revaluation gains accumulated in equity in respect of that asset, the excess shall be recognised in profit or loss.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Long leasehold property

Previously depreciated at varying rates on cost, now held at valuation.

Plant and machinery

10% reducing balance

#### Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

For the purposes of impairment testing, when it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.

#### **Stocks**

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

In arriving at cost, the cost incurred in bringing each product to its present location and condition is incorporated. Net realisable value is, wherever possible, based on actual selling price, otherwise it is estimated less further costs expected to be incurred.

#### **Employee benefits**

The company provides a range of benefits to employees.

Short term benefits, including holiday pay, are recognised as an expense in the profit and loss account in the period in which they are incurred.

The company operates a defined contribution plan for its employees. Amounts in respect of defined contribution plans are recognised as an expense in the profit and loss account when they are due.

#### 12. Summary audit opinion

The auditors report for the year ended 31 December 2017 was qualified.

Basis for disclaimer of opinion

Not all accounting records for the period from 1 January 2017 to 31 May 2017, the point at which the company changed ownership, have been obtained due to inability to access transactional details from the previous accounting system.

We were unable to obtain sufficient and appropriate audit evidence regarding the allocation and classification of income and costs in the statement of comprehensive income. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments might have been found necessary in respect of the allocation and classification of income and costs in the statement of comprehensive income for this period. We were unable to satisfy ourselves by alternative means concerning the allocation and classification of income and costs in the statement of comprehensive income for the period to 31 May 2017.

We are satisfied that the inability to audit the transactions is limited to the 5 month period of 1 January 2017 to 31 May 2017.

The audit report was signed by the senior statutory auditor on 26 September 2018.

The senior statutory auditor was Simon Owen, for and on behalf of DPC Accountants Limited, Chartered Accountants and Statutory Auditors, Vernon Road, Stoke on Trent, ST4 2QY.
