1. Fundamental accounting concept

The financial statements have been prepared under the going concern concept because the parent undertaking has agreed to provide adequate funds for the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due

2. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is small

Related parties transactions

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Hendy Holdings Limited, the consolidated accounts of which are publicly available

Accordingly, the company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 8 from disclosing transactions with members or investees of the Hendy Holdings Limited group

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows

Fixtures and Fittings

- 20% on cost

Motor Vehicles

- 15% on cost

Equipment

- 20% to 33 1/3% on cost

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, tax, with the following exceptions

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

Stock

Stock is valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is based on the cost of purchased items. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less additional costs to completion and disposal.
