The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2009

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the company in the year under review were those of manufacture and sale of packaging products. There have not been any significant changes in the company's principal activities in the year under review. The directors are not aware, at the date of this report of any likely major changes in the company's activities in the next year.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

As shown in the company's profit and loss account the company's sales have decreased by 2% over the prior year, the gross profit margin has improved to 28.5% from 24.8% largely due to a decrease in paper costs. The company have reported an operating profit in the year compared to an operating loss in 2008. The improvement is in part as a result of the increase in gross margin as a result of lower costs following the restructuring as announced at the end of 2008 that has continued throughout 2009. Net assets have increased by £2.0m in the year due to the operating profit

PAYMENT POLICY AND PRACTICE

It is the company's policy to settle the terms of payment with suppliers when agreeing the terms of the transaction, to ensure that suppliers are aware of those terms and to abide by them. Trade creditor days for the year were 75 days (2008–101 days)

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Competitive pressure in the UK is a continuing risk for the company, which could result in it losing sales to its key competitors. The company manages this risk by providing added value services to its customers, having fast response times not only in supplying products but in handling all customer queries, and by maintaining strong relationships with customers. The company's credit risk is mainly attributable to trade receivables. The risk is spread over a large number of customers, which limits exposure.

The company is exposed to interest rate changes as a result of financing being held at floating rates. The risk is minimised however due to the fact that all funding is internal with scope for negotiation.

The company is partially exposed to exchange rate fluctuations in the Euro Zone as a result of holding inter-company balances in foreign currencies. Foreign currency bank accounts are held within the group to minimise this risk. No derivatives are used

GOING CONCERN

Having reviewed the performance of the business and the plant's capacity to generate both profits and positive cash flows, and having reviewed the existing forecasts for the period to March 2011 the directors are of the opinion that the financial statements should continue to be drawn up on a going concern basis

However, in the recent past, the directors, mindful that the current uncertain economic climate causes material uncertainty around the ability to forecast demand and contribution have also had the comfort of a commitment of continued support from the Mondi Group in the event that actual performance and cash flow generation fell short of forecasted levels

As disclosed in note 20 it is expected that in the next few weeks the company will be sold and as part of that disposal process the existing directors will resign from the business. The existing directors are therefore unable to state whether there will be continued support from the new owners of the company in the event of performance and cash flow generation falling short of that currently forecast.

EMPLOYEES

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2009

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of land and buildings, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards. These accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the proceeding year.

Cash Flow Statement

The company is exempt from preparing a cashflow statement on the basis that a consolidated cashflow statement which includes the company is presented in the financial statements of the ultimate parent undertaking, Mondi plc

Turnover

Turnover is the total amount receivable by the company for goods supplied as a principal and for services provided, excluding VAT and trade discounts

Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is provided to write off the cost or revalued amounts less estimated residual value, in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The rates of depreciation are as follows

Freehold buildings

3%

Plant and machinery

5% - 33%

No depreciation is provided on freehold land

The Group has taken advantage of the transitional provisions of FRS 15 Tangible Fixed Assets and retained the book amounts of certain freehold properties which were revalued prior to implementation of that standard. The properties were last revalued at June 1997 by Jones Lang Wootton, licensed agents and approved valuers, on the basis of existing use and the valuations have not subsequently been updated.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. In determining the cost of raw materials, consumables and goods purchased for resale, the actual purchase price is used. For work in progress and finished goods cost is taken as production cost, which includes an appropriate proportion of attributable overheads.

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the Group's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

Net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only to the extent that, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is not recognised when fixed assets are revalued unless by the balance sheet date there is a binding agreement to sell the revalued assets and the gain or loss expected to arise on sale has been recognised in the financial statements. Neither is deferred tax recognised when fixed assets are sold and it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over, being charged to tax only if and when the replacement assets are sold

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of the retained earnings of overseas subsidiaries and associates only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, dividends have been accrued as receivable or a binding agreement to distribute past earnings in future has been entered into by the subsidiary or associate

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance—sheet date—Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction—Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals under operating leases are charged on a straight-line basis over the lease term, even if the payments are not made on such a basis. Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are similarly spread on a straight-line basis over the lease term, except where the period to the review date on which the rent is first expected to be adjusted to the prevailing market rate is shorter than the full lease term, in which case the shorter period is used

Pensions

Defined contribution pension scheme

The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The amount charged against in the profit and loss account represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period.

Share-based payments

The company has applied the requirements of FRS 20 "Share-based Payments".

The company's ultimate parent company, Mondi plc, issues equity-settled share-based payments to certain employees of the company Equity-settled share-based payments are measured at fair value (excluding the effect of non market-based vesting conditions) at the date of the grant. The fair value determined at the grant date of the equity-settled share-based payments is expensed on a straight-line basis over the vesting period, based on the company's estimate of shares that will eventually vest and adjusted for the effect of non market-based vesting conditions.

Fair value is measured by use of the Black-Scholes pricing model. The expected life used in the model has been adjusted, based on management's best estimate, for the effects of non-transferability and behavioural considerations.
