Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 5 April 2008

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 5 April 2008. The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is constituted as a Company limited by guarantee, and is governed by memorandum and articles of association.

The trustees meet every two months.

The directors are also the trustees of the charity and comprise its membership. Trustees are appointed by the existing board at each annual general meeting, being proposed by members. One third of the trustees retire by rotation at each annual general meeting. When a trustee resigns they also resign as a member.

Trustee vacancies and additional appointments may be made by the trustees, such trustees holding office only until the next following AGM.

Day-to-day management of the charity is delegated to the Director and Business Manager, who attend and present to the trustees at the bi-monthly meetings.

The charity is advised by a steering committee, whose members are not trustees and whose role is advisory only.

A Finance Committee meets every six months and reports to the trustees at the following full meeting. The Chair, Deputy Treasurer and Business Manager sit on the committee.

Activities

The principal activities of the charity are to:

- 1 Advise and assist persons with alcohol or drug related problems, or who are suffering from eating disorders or connected personal problems associated in overcoming those problems
- 2 Assist the families and dependants of such persons
- 3 Advance the education of the general public with regard to the misuse of drugs, alcohol and other substances.

Achievements and performance

Staff & Developments

In April 2007 Cyswllt welcomed its new director, Nicky Webb. Nicky has a background in substance misuse and social work and brings to Cyswllt invaluable experience from service delivery, multi agency working and commissioning perspectives. In October 2007 Nicky, along with our trainee counsellor Georgina Gray, began training in 12-step treatment on the International Addiction Counsellor Training Programme in County Tipperary. This was funded by the Drugs Intervention Programme (DIP) and Ceredigion Substance Misuse Action Team (SMAT). Nicky and Georgina will complete their training in October 2008.

The year saw Cyswllt finally take on its full complement of counsellors. The agency now employs a strong team of four fulltime and two part-time counsellors. This, residual funding from Fathers House (Aberystwyth) and capital funding from the SMAT allowed Cyswllt to fully develop its Cardigan office, which it shares with Ceredigion Care Society. A receptionist, Julie Pritchard, was recruited and the centre opened full time in January 2008. We are now providing a full treatment programme in Cardigan.

Ceredigion Care Society provides:

- Bond Schemes: general advice on housing related issues and a means of accessing finance to enable clients to secure rented accommodation.
- Tenancy Support Schemes: ongoing tenancy support to vulnerable people.

Since the plight of many substance misusers is inextricably linked with housing, partnership working with the Care Society has proved fruitful for both agencies' clients.

All have made a valuable contribution to the delivery of services to substance misusers in the area.

Projects

Supporting People

In line with its stated objective 'to advise and assist [substance misusers with]... connected personal problems in overcoming those problems', Cyswllt provided a Support Worker funded by Supporting People throughout the year. The support worker provides practical advice tailored to our clients' needs. The primary focus of the project is to help people to maintain their tenancies but also covers other practical issues such as budgeting, benefits and use of time.

Sue Lee, Cyswllt's Support Worker, was on maternity leave for most of the year. Her leave was covered by Sam Wanmer. Since we have recently gained further funding from Supporting People to expand and develop the support project, now known as the 'Wrap Around Project', Cyswllt has been in the fortunate position of being able to welcome Sue back whilst retaining Sam.

Drug Interventions Programme (DIP)

Cyswllt continued to provide the DIP for Ceredigion. The project is aimed at drug users who have entered the criminal justice system and fits Cyswllt's objective to 'advise and assist persons with alcohol or drug related problems'. The project provides both outreach to courts and custody suites throughout Ceredigion and group and one-to-one sessions with a focus on criminal activity as a consequence of substance misuse. The project went live in March 2006. Cyswllt aims to hold an annual caseload of 60 DIP clients. 10% of DIP clients went on to enter Cyswllt's abstinence based treatment programme.

Recovery & Work

2007-2008 was the final year of this European funded project which has provided a steep learning curve for the organisation and enormous benefits to clients. The 'Recovery and Work' project clearly fitted the agency's primary objective by providing clients with pre-treatment, treatment and aftercare; and a clear pathway into vocational training (in partnership with Ceredigion Training). It also aimed to widen access by helping people with travel and dependent care costs and increasing the publicity budget. 'Recovery & Work' has been extremely successful in widening access to Treatment and had begun towards the end to be effectively moving people into training. The project ended in October 2008 after running for just over two and a half years and being delivered to 124 clients. Roughly 15% of Cyswllt's funding this year was from the European Social Fund.

Services

Cyswllt's counsellors provide a range of programmes, designed to help people with substance misuse problems to understand them, become better able to deal with the consequences of their problem and to overcome them. All programmes are supplemented by one-to-one counselling where appropriate or requested.

The programmes available are:

Drug and Alcohol Awareness Programme (DAAP)

A group session that meets once a week and runs for six weeks. It is designed for people who are experiencing difficulties in their lives as a result of their misuse of drugs, alcohol or food.

Day Treatment

A 12-week, 5 day per week intensive programme, where clients who have abstained from substance misuse work with counsellors and each other, to prepare themselves for a life free of substance misuse.

Aftercare

A group programme that runs for one afternoon per week and lasts for a maximum of one year after successful completion of the day treatment programme. The programme provides essential peer support to them during the vulnerable stage of early recovery.

Family Programme

A weekly group for close friends and family of people misusing substances. Allows family members to meet, attend lectures, share experiences and learn more about the problems facing their loved ones and how best to support them whilst taking care of themselves.

Detoxification

Cyswllt's day treatment programme is abstinence based and as such clients need to be free from drugs and alcohol to join and continue on the programme. For some clients this can only be achieved through a process of detoxification, either at a residential centre or through local community based support. Historically there has been a lack of residential detoxification facilities in Ceredigion, but for another year, the Ceredigion Community Safety Partnership has made funds available to allow us to send clients to suitable residential centres outside the county to be detoxified.

Eating disorders

Cyswllt uses (CBT) Cognitive Behavioural Therapy to work with eating disorder clients on a day basis. The agency does not accept referrals of clients with a (BMI) Body Mass Index of less than 18.5 (equivalent to 5 stone in a woman) since it does not employ medical staff or have residential facilities. These clients are referred back to their GP or to mental health services.

Increased referrals of eating disorder sufferers in 2006 led to recognition within the organisation that more specialised training was needed. In 2007 our senior counsellor - Adam Weston - completed his diploma at the National Centre for Eating Disorders in London and a second counsellor - Ivan Courtier - is about to complete the same training. Cyswllt is currently seeking specific funding to work with eating disorders and hopes to develop a group programme in 2009.

Education, Training & Information

A considerable amount of training and educational work has been carried out over the year. The Schools Programme has been delivered to all year eight pupils in Penglais School. In addition Cyswllt has delivered training to staff within local voluntary and statutory agencies.

The website www.recovery.org.uk continues to be acknowledged as one of the most informative sites for anyone seeking advice and help on alcohol or drug related problems and those suffering from eating disorders.

Activities

The Agency as a whole received 345 referrals this year, comprising 282 to the Aberystwyth Centre and 63 to Cardigan. Overall referrals were down on last year by 10%. This is primarily due to the decision to cease publicity in the final quarter of 2006-2007 due to lack of counselling staff. However, 66% referrals attended assessment this year, which represents a 7% improvement on last year.

'Alcohol only' clients still make up the greatest proportion of Cyswllt's work. However, the percentage of these clients has steadily reduced by 4% each year since 2005-2006. The geographical distribution of referrals is broadly similar to last year with the greatest proportion (57%) of Cyswllt's clients still being drawn from the SY23 area. However, roughly 10% of clients were from out of county.

Referral sources into the Cardigan office have broadened this year to form a stable base. Here, although criminal justice referrals continue to make up the lion's share, we have begun to receive referrals form Prism, WWSMS, GPs and Social Services. This is impressive for a new service since no advertising took place last year.

Although numbers of clients going through programmes in 2007-8 was one third lower than the previous year (75 clients as opposed to 116 in the previous year), drop-out rates were greatly reduced. Much of this was due to having more counsellors which allowed group programmes to be backed up by one-to-one counselling. This had a dramatic affect on the DIP which saw retention rates double.

The year saw an increase in clients worked with on a one-to-one basis rather than entering programmes at all. This occurred for two main reasons:

- No Treatment Programme in Cardigan
- Increased work with Eating Disorder clients with no suitable group for them to attend.

This change in delivery pattern has both cost and waiting time implications. It has been partially addressed by setting up Pre-treatment Groups in both locations and limiting the caseload of eating disorder clients.

Thanks

We would also like to thank all of the Community Councils who donated funds to us and Father's House (Aberystwyth) for passing on their residual funding.

Policies and Financial Management

- The charity seeks to set aside out of its unrestricted funds sufficient to cover immediate staff costs (notice & redundancy), and the average amount of central running costs for a one-month period, should it face an unexpected shortfall in funding. The amount is currently £50,041.
- 2 The trustees are empowered by the Articles of Association to invest the funds of the Charity as they see fit. Any funds not required for immediate expenditure are placed in a bank deposit account until required.
- 3 The trustees confirm that they have identified major risks to which the charity is exposed and have established systems to mitigate these risks.

Internal financial risks are minimised by the implementation of control and authorisation procedures.

Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety for staff, clients and visitors to the centre.

The implementation of the Drugs and Alcohol National Occupational Standards (DANOS) over the next two years will ensure a consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charity.

All procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they continue to meet the needs of the charity.

Financial position

Cyswilt has expanded rapidly over the last three years due to demand and to a number of new funding streams. This year (08-09) Contact struggled to fill the gap left by European funding. However, long-term commitments from donors now cover 63% of the following year (09-10).

Considerable efforts have been made since September 2007 to raise money from the latest European funds. Rob Allen of Cyswllt is currently acting as chair of a pan Wales consortium attempting to draw down an additional five years of European funding. Is is hoped that this work will bear fruit in the coming year. The agency is also appealing to a number of trusts to consider contributing towards its running costs over the next three years.

Directors, Trustees and Members

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 5 April 2008

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985.

The accounts are prepared on the going concern basis. The period considered by the directors in assessing the going concern basis extends to the end of April 2009 only, since many of the donors to Cyswllt Contact commit themselves to funding for a period of one year only.

1.2. Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

1.3. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of training time provided to clients by other agencies is quantified on the basis of teaching hours provided. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

The charity commissions certain services from other agencies on behalf of its clients. Where these services are funded by a third party and paid in cash by the third party directly to the commissioned agency, the value of these services are not included in the charity's accounts.

Income raised to fund the budgeted expenditure of future periods is treated as deferred income in the current period.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 5 April 2008

1.4. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resources. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly. Support costs are apportioned on an appropriate basis as described in Note 7.

Where the administrative burden of identifying particular support costs to be charged to a restricted fund is too onerous then these are charged in total to the restricted fund.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity.

1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Leasehold properties

Straight line over the life of the lease

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

25% straight line

Assets costing less than £500 are not capitalised.

1.6. Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.
