Principal activities

Notes to the financial statements

1 Company information

Financial Services Net Limited ('FSN' or the Company') is a private limited hability company incorporated and domiciled in England and Wales The Company has elected to prepare its annual report and financial statements in accordance with UK GAAP

2 Statement of accounting policies for the year ended 31 December 2012

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Company's financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards

Under Financial Reporting Standard (FRS') 1 'Cash flow statements', the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that its ultimate parent, Moneysupermarket com Group PLC, includes the Company in its own published consolidated financial statements

Going concern

Since the end of the year in light of the performance of the Company, the Directors have considered the future prospects available to the Company, and subsequent to this do not expect to make further investments in the medium term. In the intervening period, Moneysupermarket com Group PLC (the 'Group') will continue to provide support to the Company. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Revenue recognition

The Company generates fees from internet lead generation through a variety of contractual arrangements. The Company's policy is to recognise turnover and associated costs in the period that the lead was generated and transferred to the end customer.

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates in force for the year

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more or less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date except as otherwise required by FRS 19. Timing differences are differences between the Company's taxable profits or losses and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only to the extent that on the basis of all available evidence it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Website development costs

Website development expenditure has been expensed during the period as it did not meet the criteria for capitalisation

A reduction in the UK corporation tax rate from 26% to 25% (effective from 1 April 2012) was substantively enacted on 5 July 2011, and further reductions to 24% (effective from 1 April 2012) and 23% (effective from 1 April 2013) were substantively enacted on 26 March 2012 and 3 July 2012 respectively

This will reduce the company's future current tax charge accordingly

The March 2013 Budget announced that the rate will further reduce to 20% by 2015 in addition to the planned reduction to 21% by 2014 previously announced in the December 2012 Autumn Statement. It has not yet been possible to quantify the full anticipated effect of the announced further 3% rate reduction although this will further reduce the company's future current tax charge accordingly
