NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 29 FEBRUARY 2008

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The full financial statements, from which these abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

1.2 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods and services supplied, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

1.3 Intangible fixed assets and amortisation

Goodwill is the difference between amounts paid on the acquisition of a business and the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities. It is amortised to the profit and loss account over its estimated economic life.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Fixtures & fittings

25% straight line

1.5 Leasing and hire purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Assets acquired by finance lease are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Assets acquired by hire purchase are depreciated over their useful lives. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

1.6 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation.

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Goodwill arose on the purchase of the assets and trade of a limited business by Matrix (Nuneaton) Limited. It had been transferred from Matrix Nuneaton Limited at its net book value at 1 March 2005 and is being amortised over 10 years on the original cost of £30,000. In the opinion of the directors, this represents a prudent estimate of the period over which the company will derive economic benefit.

6. Related party transactions

During the year the company traded with Interlet Limited. This company is a fellow subsiduary of Interlet Limited.

The company made sales of £1,177,873 (2007: £302,316) to Interlet Limited. Sales of £3,146,786 (2007: £5,610,014) were made on behalf of 247 Management UK Limited by Interlet Limited. At the year end £381,746 (2007: £175,303) was owed to 247 Management UK Limited by Interlet Limited, this is included in the trade debtors balance.

The company also traded with Depho Estates Limited, an associated company, generating sales of £18,253 (2007: £17,398). At the year end the company was owed £10,617 (2007: £4,459).

During the year the company made loans to Mike Walker, David Brooks and Peter Hoban, a shareholder in the parent company, these balances were still outstanding at the year end and the balances are included in other debtors.

7. Controlling party

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of 247 Interlet Limited.
