DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1999.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The Company's principal activity during the year was that of unit trust and OEIC management.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The operating loss for the year amounted to £125,899.

During the year the company received £172,000 for tax losses surrendered to Homeowners Friendly Society Limited and consequently returned a profit on ordinary activities after taxation of £52,336.

On 22 November 1999 the unit trusts managed by the company were converted to OEICs.

On 26 November 1999 the company changed its name from Homeowners Unit Trust Managers Limited to Homeowners Investment Fund Managers Limited.

Following the conversion of the unit trusts to OEICs Homeowners Friendly Society Limited purchased shares for £14,555,000. This amount is included in turnover. It is envisaged that this increase in fund size will result in a small profit before tax in the coming year.

DIVIDENDS

The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend for the year.

DIRECTORS

The present membership of the board is set out on page 1.

R F Pierce was appointed director and Chairman on 12 August 1999.

There are no directors' interests requiring disclosure under the Companies Act 1985.

AUDITOR

The directors will place a resolution before a General Meeting to re-appoint Ernst & Young as auditor for the coming year, at a remuneration to be agreed by the Directors.
