1. AUTHORISATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH FRS 101

The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework (FRS101) and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

The Company's Financial Statements are presented in pound sterling and values rounded to the nearest thousand except when otherwise stated.

The Financial Statements were approved for issue by the Board of Directors on 20 July 2017.

The principle accounting policies adopted by the Company are set out in note 2.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Basis of preparation

The accounting policies which follow set out those policies which apply in preparing the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2016.

The Company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions under FRS 101, as the results are included in the consolidated accounts of ABB Ltd:

- (a) the requirement in paragraph 38 of IAS 1 Presentation of Financial Statements to present comparative information in respect of:
 - (i) paragraph 79(a)(iv) of IAS 1;
- (b) the requirements of paragraphs 10(d), 10(f), 16, 38(a) 38(d), 40(a) 40(d), 111 and 134 -136 of IAS 1 Presentation of Financial Statements;
- (c) the requirements of IAS 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- (d) the requirements of paragraphs 30 and 31 of IAS 8 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors;
- (e) the requirements of paragraph 17 and 18A of IAS 24 Related Party Disclosures; and
- (f) the requirements in IAS 24 Related Party Disclosures to disclose related party transactions entered into between two or more members of a group, provided that any subsidiary which is a party to the transaction is wholly owned by such a member;

2.2 Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of Financial Statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the balance sheet date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates.

There were no judgements (apart from those involving estimates) that had a significant effect on amounts recognised in the Financial Statements.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

2.3 Significant accounting policies

Going concern

The Financial Statements have been prepared on a going concern basis because the Directors have received confirmation from a fellow subsidiary of its intention to provide financial support to enable the Company to continue operating and to meet its liabilities as they fall due for a minimum of twelve months from the date of signature of these Financial Statements

Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised on service agreements as it is invoiced, based on the agreed contractual terms to reflect the service provided.

Interest income

Revenue is recognised as interest accrues.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

Operating leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

Pensions

Pensions benefits are provided by a Group defined benefit scheme. Contributions to the scheme are charged to the profit and loss account as they are incurred, based on pensions costs across the Group as a whole.

Provisions

A provision is recognised when the Company has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligations, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. If the effect is material, expected future cash flows are discounted using a current pre-tax rate, that reflects, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability.

3 TURNOVER

Turnover represents the amount derived from the provision of goods and services which fall within the Company's ordinary activities stated net of value added tax. All turnover originates in the UK.

The Finance Act 2016 was enacted on 15 September 2016 and this further reduced the UK corporation tax rate to 17% from 1 April 2020.

12. PENSIONS COMMITMENTS

Pension benefits are provided by a Group defined benefit pension scheme, which is funded externally under the supervision of a board of trustees.

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Contributions to this scheme are charged to the profit and loss account as they are incurred, based upon pension costs across the Group as a whole. Total annual contributions to the scheme are based on independent actuarial advice, and are gauged to the future pension liabilities (including projected increases in earnings and pensions) in respect of the service up to the balance sheet date.

All actuarial variances and differences in amounts funded are accounted for in the accounts of a fellow subsidiary ABB Limited.

It is not possible to identify the Company's share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the pension scheme. The Company therefore accounts for its pensions contributions to the scheme on a defined contribution basis as permitted by IAS 19. The net deficit on the ABB Limited scheme as at 31 December 2016 is £148,450,000 (2015: £41,628,000).

Total pension contributions of £15,800 (2015: £10,200) were made during the year of which £1,500 (2015: £1,500) remained unpaid at the year end.

13. FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS

At 31 December 2016 the Company had no annual commitments under non-cancellable operating leases (2015: nil).

14. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption in paragraph 17 of IAS 24 from disclosing transactions with other wholly owned related parties that are part of the ABB Ltd group. There are no other related party transactions requiring disclosure.

15. ULTIMATE HOLDING COMPANY

The immediate parent undertaking is ABB Holdings Limited. The ultimate holding company is ABB Ltd, a company incorporated in Switzerland.
