The Trustees present their report and the accounts of Teme Valley Youth Project Limited, also known as TVYP, for the year ended 31 March 2010

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 3 October 1996 and registered as a Charity on 16 May 1997

The Company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association

Principal Activities

The Charity's principal activity continues to be the provision of ongoing support and information for local young people aged 14 - 25 years through Centre based and outreach services. The charity offeres a range of educational, training, social, leisure and independent living. Commencing in October 2010 the Trustees will extend the ages covered to include young people from age 11 (year 7 upwards).

Progress and achievements

This year the Trustees focussed on the tough task of reducing costs and services to survive whilst developing the centre in such a way as to increase income generation

We successfully

- recruited and trained community volunteers to provide youth sessions
- restarted regular youth sessions, activities and volunteering opportunities
- reduced expenditure
- created a business plan
- restructured the centre to provide funds from attractive space to hire
- developed further funding strategies
- created new marketing materials and re-branded the centre as Mortimer Enterprise Centre We plan to continue to build on this success

1 Accounting policies

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (2008), the Companies Act 2006 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice issued in 2005
- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

- d) Other incoming resources are included when receivable
- Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they incurred Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered
- f) Resources expended are allocated to the particular activity where the cost relates to that activity
- g) Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its estimated useful life
- Unrestricted funds are bank interest, miscellaneous income and any donations or grants without specified purpose and are available as general funds
- Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Board for a particular purpose
- j) Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund

12 Purpose of restricted funds (alphabetic)

Becket Bulmer Fund

This grant was for ARTiculate, a small arts project to support young people to use their artistic flair to transform a shabby space as an exciting attractive environment for youth activities in the centre
