The Trustees (who are also the Directors under Company Law) present their report and accounts for the year ended 31st October 2008.

The information contained on page 1 forms a part of this report.

In fulfilment of their responsibilities under Company and Charity law, the Trustees prepared statements of accounting policies, practices and financial statements. These statements were submitted to the appointed Accountants.

Background

Weight Concern was incorporated as a private limited company on 24th October 1996 and registered as a charity. At that date, the group which had planned the charity's inception was designated the Planning Committee of Weight Concern.

Weight Concern relies on funds received from charitable donations, or from voluntary fundraising activities, which includes applications for grants or scholarships for the funding of its research work or staff. Income is also generated from the running of training courses for health professionals.

Weight Concern aims to engage the public, policy makers, health professionals and scientists in an effective, co-ordinated effort to slow and reverse the obesity epidemic.

Company status

The charitable company is limited by guarantee, incorporated on 24th October 1996 under company number 3268842 and registered with the charity commission, number 1059686. The company was established under the Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company, and is governed under its Articles.

Organisation

The charity is managed by a Council of Management consisting of the Trustees. All provide their services voluntarily. The Council establishes and convenes meetings of Committees and sub-committees, as appropriate, to further its work. These committees report directly to Council. Where individuals wish to assist in the planning and running of the charity, they may apply for membership.

'Friends' of Weight Concern support the charity's objectives with a financial donation.

New Trustees are appointed in accordance with the terms of the company's Articles. There must be a minimum of 3 trustees, and a maximum of 8, in office at any given time.

Principal Activities

The principal activities for which Weight Concern is established are:

- to advance the knowledge of the general public about the causes, prevention and treatment of obesity;
- (b) to identify more effective treatments for obesity;
- (c) to provide education and training for health professionals in the management and prevention of obesity.

Review of Activities

2007/08 was a successful year for Weight Concern. Many projects were continued and developed from the previous year and a variety of new activities were undertaken, including:

Research activities

Traffic Light Programme

The randomised controlled trial of a childhood obesity treatment in collaboration with Great Ormond Street Hospital and Cancer Research UK has been completed, apart from some ongoing follow up assessments. This study started in 2003 and aims to assess the clinical viability of a treatment developed in the US by Len Epstein. Informal feedback from parents and children on their experience continues to be extremely positive. The results are currently being analysed and written up for publication.

The Big Panel

This is our national online database of individuals who are or have been overweight. The aims are to collect information about the strategies that people use to control weight, understand which are most effective, and explore how people maintain their weight in the longer-term. This was launched in early 2006 and since then has expanded rapidly with a total of 1000 individuals signed up. Research conducted in 2007/08 included:

- · Survey of terms people prefer health professionals use to describe weight
- Evaluation of Cancer Research UK leaflets: Wish you could stay in shape? Wish you knew the truth about diet and cancer?
- Overcoming barriers to exercise
- Overweight Health Professionals giving weight management advice
- The Perceptions of Health Professionals and Overweight People (DH)
- Qualitative study of photographic images used in health promotion materials.

This unique user perspective has been invaluable in informing our work, and also the work of other colleagues working in the sector.

Shape Up Sister

Shape-Up Sister is an internet based online healthy lifestyle programme designed specifically for African and Caribbean women. Shape-Up Sister aims to help reduce the risk of diabetes, heart disease and some cancers by promoting weight loss, healthy eating and physical activity. It is a behavioural approach to managing eating and physical activity that includes information on culturally appropriate food examples and cooking techniques.

At present, Shape-Up Sister is being evaluated in a research study involving 220 black British women.

Cancer Research UK

We undertook an independent evaluation of Cancer Research UK leaflets: Wish you could stay in shape? Wish you knew the truth about diet and cancer? on a consultancy basis. This combined quantitative research with the Big Panel and a series of focus groups conducted across the UK. The result of this work were a series of recommendations for Cancer Research UK's two new leaflets.

Department of Health

On behalf of the Department of Health we undertook a preliminary investigation into the experience and beliefs of overweight health care providers who provide weight management advice and the views and perception of information of patients receiving weight-related information from overweight health

practitioners. It used interviews with health care providers and two questionnaires (one for overweight health professionals, one for the Big Panel). This was included in the Department of Health publication 'Healthy Weight, Healthy Lives: A toolkit for developing local strategies'.

Weight Feedback project

This project, which was funded by the BHF, was successfully completed. The results were published in the peer-reviewed journal 'Pediatrics' in September 2008.

Information activities

Website

The Weight Concern website continues to be developed to reflect the information needs of its various user groups, which include health professionals, policy makers and the media in addition to individuals seeking information about weight issues. New additions include guidance about waist circumference and information about increasing physical activity for people with limited mobility.

Media work

The charity continued to respond to many requests for comment from the media on various aspects of adult and child obesity.

Booklets and Shape-Up manual

Weight Concern's range of publications continues to be very popular.

Ten Top Tips campaign

Weight Concern continued its partnership with Cancer Research UK to develop and pilot 'Ten Top Tips', a programme based on the principle of helping people adopt behaviours which will lead to the development of healthy habits to facilitate weight loss. Developments in 2007/08 included a reformatted version of Ten Top Tips aimed at men.

Newsletter

Dr Susan Carnell continues to edit the Weight Concern newsletter, producing 3 publications per year.

Support activities

Training

The two training courses offered by Weight Concern were well-attended during the year. A variety of health professionals including representatives from a number of Primary Care Trusts from across the country were trained in Shape-Up group facilitation techniques and this expanded the number of Shape-Up Groups being run in different areas of the country. Attendees on the 2007/08 programmes widened to include prison staff, occupational health nurses and police officers.

The charity's three-day course on the behavioural treatment of childhood obesity was also very well received.

British Heart Foundation Training

Weight Concern worked with the British Heart Foundation to develop and deliver a two day staff training programme (with additional ongoing support) focusing on behaviour change and motivational techniques. This was for telephone helpline staff who would be working with callers to provide information and guidance on a new service, the 'Heart Health Lifestyle Assessments'.

Shape-Up Groups

Numerous PCTs are now running Shape-Up groups with over 700 facilitators trained across the UK. A qualitative evaluation of active PCTs was undertaken which will be used to develop further support mechanisms for facilitators.

Shape-Up weight maintenance programme

Weight Concern developed and piloted a weight maintenance programme, a project being run in partnership with Camden PCT. The aims of this are to provide support to people who have attended a Shape-Up group in the longer-term.

Financial Review

We continued to receive funding from the Department of Health and the Central Office of Information and additionally received project funding from Cancer Research UK.

Incoming resources this year have decreased slightly however to £144,636 (2007: £161,414), which is largely due to a reduction in incoming grant funding; the UCL grant received in 2007 was a one off grant for us to input into the Shape-Up Sister project over the course of its 3 year duration and the final year of the Department of Health core funding was for a reduced amount compared to previous years.

In the last financial year, the charity put aside funding to support work in putting applications together for longer term projects such as the Big Panel project as well as continue our work for Shape-Up Sister. We have continued to provide a substantial amount of input for Shape-Up Sister and significantly developed our work using the Big Panel. Small amounts of funding were received from the Department of Health and Cancer Research UK to support this work, but we have not been able to make progress with other funding applications, which we were not unduly surprised about given the current economic climate. Over the next financial year we plan to concentrate on developing a training strategy as we plan to extend the range of courses that we run and invest in work on working with PCTs regarding the commissioning of training. This is important as the provision and commissioning of training is currently undergoing significant changes which will impact on our future work in this area.

The maintenance of strong reserves will allow us to undertake the projects which have been outlined and to better fulfil one of the charity's core aims and objectives which is to provide education and training for health professionals in the management and prevention of obesity. We are particularly keen to expand the range of training available for health professionals and other individuals working in this area, and to develop a strategy to support this work.

Funding

The continuation of the three-year grant was awarded to Weight Concern by the Department of Health under its Section 64 programme and assisted the charity in continuing and expanding its activities.

Weight Concern is grateful to all its funders and supporters for their contributions to the charity's work.

Reserves Policy

The organisation requires free reserves to counter the contingent effects involved in a winding up of the charity. The level of reserves which the trustees believe to be appropriate represents a minimum of 6 months of anticipated operating costs.

The total charity reserves at 31st October 2008 were £144,060 (2007: £135,955), of which £109,004 (2007: £82,393) were considered to be free (i.e. not earmarked for particular purposes). The Trustees are satisfied with the current position.

Trustees' interest

The Board of Trustees do not have any interest, financial or otherwise, in any contract with the company. All Trustees serve on a voluntary basis to promote the charity's activities.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the income and expenditure of the company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Accountants

Kingston Smith LLP have indicated their willingness to continue in office and in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act it is proposed that they be re-appointed accountants for the ensuing year.

Small company rules

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part VII of the Companies Act 1985 relating to small companies and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 31st October 2008

1 Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

(b) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

(c) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the SOFA when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

Incoming resources from charitable trading activity are accounted for when earned.

(d) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Cost of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the external accountants review fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SOFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

(e) Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided as rates calculated to write off the costs of each assets over its estimated useful life, which in all cases is estimated at 1 year.
