The Directors present their Annual Report and the Accounts of the Company for the year ended 29th February 2004.

Statement of Directors Responsibilities

Company law requires the Directors to prepare Accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and of the profit or loss of the Company for that period. In preparing those Accounts, the Directors are required to:

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.

Make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.

Follow applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the Accounts.

Prepare the Accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Nature of the Company

Vineyard Church Sutton was incorporated on 17th February 1997 as a charitable company limited by guarantee (Company Registration No. 3319200, Charity Registration No. 1061363/0 ("the Company"). The Company has been granted exemption from using the word "limited" in its title. The Company's financial year is March to February. It is therefore accountable to the Charity Commissioners and to Companies House and is required to comply with both charity and company legislations.

Registered Office

The registered office of the Company is Unit 3, 5 Robin Hood Lane, Sutton, Surrey, SM1 2SW.

Object of the Company

The primary object of the Company is the advancement of the Christian faith. This has been achieved by the establishment of a local congregation meeting on Sundays at Overton Grange School, Sutton, Surrey.

Review of the Period

The church has grown during this period to over 200 adults regularly attending Sunday morning services. Areas of ministry offered outside of Sunday Services still include youth work, new small groups and worship celebrations. Compassionate ministry has maintained its focus with Sutton Furniture Project which the church has continued to fund and provide office space for. Church members have continued to support the project.

A major undertaking during the year was the set-up of the church ministry centre at Robin Hood Lane providing a central meeting place for various church meetings and ministry in addition to office space.

Jason and Beverley Clark continue to be employed by the church with Jason being employed full time and Beverley on a part time basis. Given the continued growth of the church and the resultant administration, the church has also now employed two people who had been volunteering their services, one full time and one part time.

Goals for last year and the year ahead

Plans for March 2003 and February 2004 financial year

- 1. Continued development of Sunday services continued growth of regular Sunday services, added members and increased number of kids' age groups for Sunday school.
- 2. Multiplied small groups the small group midweek meetings in people's homes of the church members.
- 3. Leased an office and ministry centre for staff, administration team and community project.
- 4. Offered the opportunity of training and development in church leadership and ministry through the employment of a Student Trainee Pastor and the involvement on 2 Interns in the daily life of the church
- 5. Continued communication of Vineyard Values through newcomers meals / meetings and newcomers small groups
- 6. Continued support of Sutton Furniture Project a community project providing furniture and household items to people referred from various agencies.
- 7. Our church's role in the Emergent Network continued, best showcased by the national conference hosted by the church in November 2003.

Plans for March 2004 to February 2005

- 1. Employment of a full-time Senior Assistant Pastor to lead, develop and grow ministries and small groups within the church.
- 2. Identify, train and develop new leaders within the church for roles in Vineyard Church ministries and small groups.
- 3. Continue to invest in training and development of both paid and voluntary staff to be more effective in their roles at Vineyard Church.
- 4. Redesign the current Kid's church work and create the new Vineyard Kids Sutton (VKS) ministry as a more dynamic, vibrant and relevant ministry for children aged 2-13 years.
- 5. Support the Senior Pastors, both spiritually and financially, to undertake a 5-week sabbatical, allowing them to reenergise for the future of Vineyard Church Sutton.
- 6. Plant a new satellite church from Vineyard Church Sutton in the Epsom/Ewell/ Ashtead area.
- 7. Continue the development of Sunday services achieving growth of regular attendance at Sunday services, added members and increased number of kids' age groups for VKS.
- 8. Continue to support the Sutton Furniture Project as our key ministry to the poor a community project providing furniture and household items to people referred from various agencies.
- 9. Our church's role in the Emergent Network will continue, best showcased by the national conference being hosted by the church in December 2004.

The plans outlined above indicate how we intend to establish the necessary organisational structure to support existing and planned activities. Further to the above, reserves and investment policies will be developed and formalised in the coming year. We have also given consideration to the major risks to which the charity is exposed, reviewed them and established systems to mitigate them. It will be noted that the charity has reported an accounting deficit for the current period. This has largely been driven by the increased depreciation charge relating to acquisitions made for the set up of the new Ministry Centre. Income budgets for the coming year have been deliberately set conservatively and a zero-based approach to expenditure budgets adopted to ensure all costs are contained. We believe this strategy will result in this deficit being eradicated in the coming year.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow the recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting for Charities (SORP) issued in October 2000.

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts. It is shown in full in the Statement of Financial Activities, when received. Gifts in kind are valued at their estimated value to the charity and are included under the appropriate headings.

Intangible income is valued and included in income to the extent that it represents goods or services where another party is bearing the financial cost and the benefit is quantifiable. Where it is difficult or not possible to quantify the benefit, ore where there is no financial cost borne by another party (e.g., volunteers), the accounts do not include the intangible income.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are received.

Restricted funds are to be used for specified purposes as required by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is allocated to the relevant fund. Income derived from these funds is retained within the funds concerned. Designated funds are unrestricted funds which the trustees have designated to be used for a specific purpose. Where these funds yield investment income, this is available for general purposes. Unrestricted funds are funds which are not designated or restricted.

There has been no change to the accounting policies (Valuation rules and methods of accounting) since last year.

Depreciation is calculated at a rate to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives. The basis and rates applied per annum are as follows:
