1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules.

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement conferred by Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 on the grounds that it qualifies as a small company under the Companies Act 1985.

Fixed Asset Investments

Fixed Asset Investments are stated at the mid-market value at the Balance Sheet date. Gains or losses arising on the revaluation are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities and credited or charged to the Unrestricted Funds.

Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

18 Guarantees and other financial commitments

The current lease obligation for the shop unit at Tilbury of £4,000 per annum expires in September 1999. Negotiations for a new lease at £3,750 per annum are in hand.

19 Related party transactions

Mr E Camp received a contribution towards expenses of £1,500.

Mrs M Marsen received £1,000 honourarium for secretarial work.

Mrs N Heigho organises the street collection and was re-imbursed the sum of £331 in respect of expenses incurred thereon.

Mr T Murray provides legal services to the charity and he was reimbursed the sum of £7,901 as a contribution towards his legal services, as a result of extensive and protracted legal services necessary on the creation of a lease and underlease. In addition the Southend Hospital National Health Service Trust paid £1,500 towards legal fees in respect of the underlease granted to them by the charity. It was agreed by the Trustees that this money could be retained by Mr T Murray as a contribution towards the value of his legal services sustained but not rendered to the charity.

20 Contingent liabilities

A contingent liability may arise in respect of correspondence from an attendee who has alleged that the charity failed to undertake an investigative procedure. The allegation has been repudiated and it is the trustees belief that they cannot be held responsible and that no liability will arise. Consequently the financial statements contain no provision in respect thereof. However legal costs in respect thereof could be incurred and the trustees consider that these could reach £20,000.
