Our stakeholders are the people who attend our seminars and workshops, colleagues who have taken part in our activities as speakers at conferences or teachers on our courses, those who read our articles and books, and those who help us to organise and publicise our activities. We have an ongoing dialogue with all of these people and organisations into how we can expand our programme and areas of research.

During the period since our last international symposium in April 2019, we have decided to reconsider our activities and the structure of our organisation. Rising costs have made several of our activities financially unsustainable. We, therefore, have started to reconsider our purpose so we can continue to provide an educational forum to study sound in the arts and media. This was interrupted by the Covid pandemic and ensuing lockdown from March 2020. At that point, consultations and future planning ceased.

Since then, we have become convinced that we must take our activities online in order to offer our services to a much wider audience. Planning began in 2021 with the aim of being operational in spring 2022. However, delays in building our website pushed our deadline into 2023. Therefore, for the greater part of 2022 and into 2023, we were in a period of organisation and planning. This involved re-connecting with stakeholders and partners where ties had been broken during the Covid lockdown.

PART 1 - General Description of the Company's Activities and Impact

The School of Sound runs various activities for artists and media practitioners to better understand the process of creating sound for audio-visual production and become more aware of the act of listening. In the year to 30 June 2022 we have:

- Continued to act as a point of contact for those wishing to learn more about this subject. This includes disseminating information and written material, career advice, and education and training advice. This goes to people in the UK and abroad.
- Due to the continuing effects of Covid, we were unable to hold our live event or in-person workshops.
- We began a period of restructuring our activities in order to offer them online to a more diverse audience and for more affordable fees. This will expand our audience to younger artists, students and practitioners beginning their careers.
- We are changing the emphasis of our activities to become an online resource for those working in the arts and media and education in these fields, and to act as an adjunct to higher education and arts programmes.
