Structure, governance and management

The trust is a company limited by guarantee.

The trustees, who are also the directors for the purpose of company law, who served during the year are listed above.

None of the trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the trustees are members

company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

Uniting Britain Trust is managed and administered by staff at the Stone Ashdown Trust, that is itself in the process of winding up in 2009. Detailed negotiations are currently taking place with an interested party to bring in new Trustees and pass over management and administration of the Uniting Britain Trust. In the event of these negotiations being unsuccessful, the Uniting Britain Trust will be wound up.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the trust is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

There are no related parties to the charity.

Objectives and activities

The company is a registered charity (No 1063484) and limited by guarantee (not having a share capital).

The trust's objects are anything that is of charitable nature which are in conformity with the laws of United Kingdom and in particular elimination of racism.

The principal activities of the charity are to work towards the elimination of racial discrimination and to promote equality of opportunity and good relations between persons of different racial groups.

United Britain Trust continued to act as a development agency, nurturing community initiatives, developing projects and establishing independent organisations. The charity has provided accommodation and administrative support, expert advice on strategic planning and organisational structure, and managing grants from other funders.

Projects supported by the trust during the year were:

- (i) developing positive contacts between British Muslims and British Jews through the Schools Linking Project of Alif-Aleph UK, a one year programme funded by the City Bridge Trust bringing together pupils from Muslim and Jewish faith schools in London;
- (ii) supporting two young Muslim researchers at the Centre for Muslim Affairs, exploring attitudes to Britishness and faith identity, and organising a successful day conference in London;
- (iii) assisting the REALLITY project towards organisational independence, whilst working with young people in communities in north London to promote positive images and combat attraction of gang culture.

Uniting Britain Trust is currently administered by the Stone Ashdown Trust. This arrangement will cease in 2009 and all activities are in abeyance whilst discussions regarding future administrative arrangements take place.

Financial review

It has been the policy of the trust that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees considered that reserves at this level were necessary to ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they would be able to continue the trust's activities. This policy will now be reviewed in light of reserves being run down over this financial year, and deliberations on the possible future direction of the Uniting Britain Trust.

Principal funding source

The principal funding source was the Stone Ashdown Trust.

Trustees responsibilities

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the financial year and of its surplus or deficit for the financial year. In doing so the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- Make sound judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and

 Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is appropriate to presume that the charity will not continue in business

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and for taking reasonable precautions for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities (issued in March 2005) and in accordance with the special provisions of Part VII of the Companies Act 1985 relating to small entities.

These procedures provide only the assurance expressed in our opinion.

- (b) having regard only to, and on the basis of, the information contained in those accounting records:
 - (i) the accounts have been drawn up in a manner consistent with the accounting requirements specified in section 249C(6) of the Act; and
 - (ii) the charitable company satisfied the conditions for exemption from an audit of the accounts for the year specified in section 249A(4) of the Act and did not, at any time within that year, fall within any of the categories of companies not entitled to the exemption specified in section 249B(1).
