As laid down in the Articles of Association, the affairs of the company are conducted by an elected management committee which now presents its report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2009.

The company is limited by guarantee and registered as a charity. As such, it is prohibited from paying dividends.

Object of the charity

The object of the charity is to advance the education of, protect the health of and relieve poverty and distress of physically and/or mentally disabled people. More particularly, to enhance the lives of visually impaired people by helping them to achieve greater independence.

Principal activities

The charity's principal activities during the year continued to be the provision of a personal reading, shopping and befriending service and the running of a social club, both for blind and disabled people. The charity has also undertaken the provision of a resource centre.

Review of the year

Due to the economic climate, the Trust experienced difficulty in obtaining continued funding for its projects. However, we have been active in fund raising initiatives and with the help of volunteers, have successfully maintained our projects.

Volunteers for Visually Impaired People

Vols for Vips continues to provide valuable and much needed practical help for visually impaired people in the local community. This is a unique service which continues to play a vital part in helping people with sight loss in the local community to gain more independence and feel socially included.

The success of the Vols for VIPs programmes is in the main due to the professionalism and enthusiasm of the project's dedicated staff, Melanie Kemps and Mark Lewis Lloyd. The directors give recognition and thanks for their work. Due thanks should also be accorded to all the volunteers who give their time freely and willingly.

Transcription Service

The Transcription Service provides a cost effective resource for organisations that need to supply printed material in audio format as part of their commitment to the Disability Discrimination Act. During the year our main client has been and continues to be Hammersmith and Fulham Council for their borough wide magazine H&F News.

The commitment of Mark Lewis Lloyd has been paramount in the success of this service.

Thursday Lunch Club

The Trust, with some financial assistance from the Hammersmith and Fulham Council and a grant from the Greater London Fund for the Blind, continues to operate a weekly lunch club for senior visually impaired people in the community. External funding is insufficient to cover all expenses and Action Trust for the Blind underpins the shortfall from donations and other fundraising activities. Heather Taylor and a team of dedicated volunteers organise and run the club each week from the Elgin Resource Centre. The club provides a unique opportunity for elderly, visually impaired

residents of the Borough to meet friends and engage socially outside the confines of their homes. The club is grateful to Heather Taylor and the volunteers for all their hard work.

Fundraising

The main fundraising efforts during the year have been focused on collections at London Underground and main line railway stations. The Trust is grateful to the authorities at these stations for their co-operation in permitting such collections. The Trust is, as ever, very grateful to all the volunteers who helped with these collections.

Thanks are due in no small part to the staff, volunteers and members of the board for their incredible tenacity, hard work and ceaseless cheer through a difficult year. Their persistence enabled us to continue providing our services.

As ever, fundraising is high on our list of priorities and continues to dominate in this time of economic downturn and the coming year looks no less challenging.

Our main aim is to continue through difficult financial times to make a practical and positive difference to the independence of visually impaired people in the community. Hammersmith and Fulham have one of the highest populations of visually impaired people in the country, however, there is limited specialist sensory impairment support offered by the local council.

Action Trust for the Blind believes it must maintain its role as a provider of services, which through a volunteer led programme, delivers irreplaceable practical help which empowers and supports visually impaired people to live independently and make their own decisions and choices in life.

As ever, fundraising is high on our list of priorities and continues to dominate in this time of economic downturn and the coming year looks no less challenging. In order to reduce our outgoings we made the decision to move out of our premises in October 2009 and our two permanent members of staff now maintain the servoices on a voluntary basis from home. We remain hopeful and optimistic that this is a temporary situation and that 2010 will bring new funding opportunities and sources of income.

1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historic cost and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005), the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005) and the Charities Act 1993.

Incoming resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, and the directors are virtually certain that they will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

When incoming resources have related expenditure, the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the SoFA.

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

The value of any voluntary help is not included in the accounts but is described in the directors' annual report.

Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable.

Expenditure and liabilities

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of statutory accounts, the cost of statutory meetings, and the cost of any legal advice to directors on governance or constitutional matters.

Assets

Tangible assets for use by the charity are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £100. They are valued at cost, or if gifted to the charity, at the value to the charity on receipt.
