1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Turnover

Lease Income:

The profit and loss account is credited with income, net of direct expenses, including commissions from finance leases using a method to give a constant periodic rate of return on the net investment in the lease and from operating leases using a straight line basis which apportions income evenly over the period of the lease.

For finance leases, residual values are estimated at lease inception and are included in the calculation of lease income and in net investment in finance leases.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings - 20% on cost
Motor vehicles - 20% on cost
Office equipment - 33% on cost

Depreciation is provided on operating lease and managed service assets at rates calculated to write off the cost of the assets, less estimated residual value, over their useful economic lives using methods which allocate their depreciation charges on a systematic basis to the periods which are expected to benefit from their use.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Operating leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to the profit and loss account in the period to which they relate.

Finance lease agreements

The net investment in finance leases consists of future rentals receivable and residual values, less unearned income relating to future periods.

Unearned income represents the unamortised portion of total finance charges on lease agreements relating to future accounting periods.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - continued FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Operating lease agreements

Rentals received under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Assets on hire under operating leases are classified as tangible fixed assets and are depreciated at rates calculated to write off the cost of the assets, less estimated residual value, over their estimated useful lives using methods which allocate depreciation charges on a systematic basis to periods expected to benefit from their use.

Managed service contracts

Rentals received under managed service contracts are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Assets on hire under managed service contracts are classified as tangible fixed assets and are depreciated at rates calculated to write off the cost of the assets, less estimated residual value, over their estimated useful lives using methods which allocate depreciation charges on a systematic basis to periods expected to benefit from their use.
