Achievements and Performance

The charity's objective 'to provide the relief of persons suffering from, or at risk of pressure ulcers in particular through research and education of the public' continues to be achieved

The annual meeting of 2006 was held at the Berliner Congress Center, Berlin German in August/September 2006 Again this was well attended and proved a stimulating time. This has proved to be the costliest meeting organised by the EPUAP

The National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel of USA and the Japanese Society for Pressure Ulcers continue to liaise with the EPUAP on the shear force initiative with sessions at the Berlin meeting

Prevention guidelines are being revised and updated and funds are being sought from Industry and other sources to employ a part time PhD student for this work. These guidelines are being endorsed by the NPUAP in USA who are currently updating the treatment guidelines which will be endorsed by EPUAP. With regard to the EPUAP prevention guidelines a contract was signed by the treasurer Dr. George W. Cherry with the University of Gent, Belgium on February 13th 2007 for two years employment in the amount of euros 11037.5 to be paid quarterly for Katrien Vanderwee's salary who will be working under the supervision of Professor Dr. Tom Defloor and Dr. Carol Dealey.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

The EPUAP website is updated on a regular basis and educational courses are being advertised and organised for the prevention, recognition, classification and treatment of pressure ulcers

The 10th Anniversary meeting of the EPUAP will be held in Oxford in August 2007 – a return to the venue of the First Inaugural Meeting

Membership of the Panel continues to increase and Industry is taking an active interest in the work the EPUAP is doing to meet its mission statement

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

The charity reported net outgoing resources of £39,075 for the year (2006 incoming £23,380). The trustees continually monitor the funds of the charity

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which equates to approximately six months unrestricted expenditure. This would provide sufficient funds to cover management and administration and support costs and cover publication expenses. The trustees are researching ways to meet this objective.

1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the charity's financial statements

(a) Company Status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee The members of the company are the trustees

(b) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules, and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005 and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005)

(c) Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor

(d) Income and Expenditure

Income and Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Conference income and expenditure is recognised in the year the event was held

Subscriptions are recorded on a receipts basis. The subscription period runs for one year from renewal/signing up date which may be at any time during the year. As the subscriptions are spread through the year no adjustment has been made for subscriptions in advance. Subscriptions are non-refundable.

(e) Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided using the reducing balance basis at rates which reflect the anticipated useful lives of the assets and their estimated residual values.
