#### **Objectives and Activities**

The European pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel's (EPUAP) objective is to provide relief for persons suffering from, or at risk of pressure ulcers in particular through research and education of the public

The major activities of the charity embrace education of health workers, patients and their carers in prevention and treatment of pressure ulcers. Government awareness is being raised throughout Europe into the problem by lobbying and the publishing of epidemiology studies and research into the causes of pressure ulceration.

#### **Risk Management**

The trustees have identified the major risks which the charity faces and are taking steps to mitigate those risks

#### **Achievements and Performance**

The charity continues to grow in membership and prestige throughout Europe

The Executive has now been expanded to include chairs and deputy chairs of the working committees

#### How the charity meets the public benefit

The Prevention and Treatment of pressure ulcer guidelines have now been translated into eighteen languages by members of the EPUAP and other groups worldwide. This work has been done in members' own time at their own cost, and demonstrates the dedication of the various groups. The EPUAP and NPUAP(USA) have now been joined by the Pan Pacific Pressure Ulcer Alliance (Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong Pacific Alliance) and an observer from Japan in updating the guidelines which have been widely distributed throughout the world to health care workers from all disciplines. The problem of pressure ulcers has now been highlighted with Health Care Trusts and Nursing Homes and measures are being taken in the prevention and treatment of this extremely expensive condition.

The new EPUAP web site remains popular as a forum for dissemination of research, treatment and innovation and members of the general public are free to present their problems which are then passed on to the relevant disciplines

The annual meeting was held in Porto, Portugal and despite the world wide economy down turn was attended by over 400 persons. During the meeting it was decide that the EPUAP should join other wound healing societies in presenting a 'Stop Pressure Ulcer' day in November to again raise awareness of the problem. Material including the Treaty of Rio stating that no person should be subjected to pressure ulcers would be made available by members and industry, members of parliaments would be lobbied and the media used to full effect.

#### **Financial Review and Reserves Policy**

The charity reported net outgoing resources of £11,658 for the year 2012 (2011 £9,084) The funds of the charity are continually monitored by the trustees

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which equates to approximately six months unrestricted expenditure. This would provide sufficient funds to cover management and administration and support costs and cover publication expenses. The trustees are researching ways to meet this objective.

#### **NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS**

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

#### 1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the charity's financial statements

#### (a) Company Status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees

#### (b) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules, and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005 and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

The accounts have been prepared on the going concern basis. The trustees will monitor expenditure as required

#### (c) Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor

#### (d) Income and Expenditure

Income and Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Conference income and expenditure is recognised in the year the event was held.

Monies received in respect of corporate sponsorship are allocated 25% to subscriptions and 75% to conference income. These funds are recognised on receipt

Subscriptions are recorded on a receipts basis. The subscription period runs for one year from renewal/signing up date which may be at any time during the year. As the subscriptions are spread through the year no adjustment has been made for subscriptions in advance. Subscriptions are non-refundable.

#### (e) Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided using the reducing balance basis at rates which reflect the anticipated useful lives of the assets and their estimated residual values.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts.
