Objectives and Activities

The European Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel's objective is to provide relief for persons suffering from or at risk of pressure ulcers in particular through research and education of the public.

The major activities of the charity remain involved in education of the public, health workers and patients themselves in the prevention and treatment of pressure ulcers. Also to raise awareness of the incidence and cost to governments throughout Europe.

Risk management

The trustees have identified the major risks which the charity faces and are taking steps to mitigate those risks.

Achievements and performance

The EPUAP had its 18th Annual Conference in Ghent, Belgium in September 2015, and the local organizer was our Executive Board member and Trustee, Prof. Dr. Dimitri Beeckman. The EPUAP 2015 conference in Ghent was an extraordinary success in all aspects, including the scientific contents and clinical research that were presented, the international attendance and number of participants, and the dominant presence of industry and EPUAP sponsors. The scientific programme of the conference included the French and Dutch one-day symposia that were held by our partner organisations: Afiscep in cooperation with PERSE for the French symposium, respectively EduWond, CNC and WCS for the Dutch symposium.

In April 2016 the EPUAP also held the **3rd Focus Meeting in Berlin, Germany** and the main theme was ,The Role of Skin and Tissue Maturation and Aging in Pressure Ulcer Research and Practice. The focus meeting was held the Kaiserin Friedrich-Haus in Berlin, Germany, and it was hosted by our Executive Board Members Dr. Jan Kottner and Prof. Jane Nixon.

In September 2016, EPUAP held its annual meeting in the context of the **World Union of Wound Healing Societies** (WUWHS) in Florence Italy. The EPUAP half day session was the highlight of the day and brought the focus on pressure ulcer prevention and treatment in such a complex scientific programme that had covered all aspects of wound management.

The EPUAP 2017 annual meeting will be held in Belfast, Northern Ireland between 20 and 22 September 2017 and the main theme of the programme will be *One Voice for Pressure Ulcer Prevention and Treatment Challenges and Opportunities for Practice, Research and Education.* The annual meeting will be organised by EPUAP in partnership with the Tissue Viability Nurse Network (Northern Ireland) and Wound Management Association of Ireland.

The EPUAP is growing fast and becomes stronger and more influential each year. The roles of EPUAP in creating awareness to the pressure ulcer problem, in stimulating basic and clinical research and in developing guidelines are pivotal in Europe and worldwide. One example for our far-reaching activities is the 'Stop Pressure Ulcer Day' initiative which continues to be an enormous success globally, with clinical and academic lectures and workshops, companies holding educational events, and considerable coverage in electronic and traditional healthcare media.

EPUAP and EWMA, as two of the leading organisations in the field of wound management, have launched a joined project on **PU prevention** and patient safety advocacy project. The overall aim is to establish a joint EPUAP-EWMA engagement in the PU prevention and patient safety agendas at the European level as well as at the national level in selected European countries.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

In 2015, EPUAP has given free access for all professionals to PUCLAS3, an e-learning tool that aims to further support clinical teaching and learning about pressure ulcer classification and incontinence-associated dermatitis (IAD) differentiation, as misclassification results in inadequate preventive and therapeutic measures.

The EPDAP is delighted to lead all the above initiatives and to pave the way towards near means, acience, territoringies and guidelines to prevent or minimize the impact of pressure ulcers on vulnerable populations.

How the charity meets the public benefit

The EPUAP is a thriving society, which is constantly growing in size and influence, and will continue to expand and increase its impact related to the awareness to pressure ulcers, education, research and clinical guidelines, as well as involvement of industry – which sets higher standards for patient management and care. We will continue to lead in all the above aspects across Europe.

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

The charity reported net incoming resources of £62,599 for the year 2016 (2015: £95,209). The funds of the charity are continually monitored by the trustees.

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which requates to approximately six months unrestricted expenditure. This would provide sufficient funds to cover management and administration and support costs and cover publication expenses. The trustees are researching ways to meet this objective.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the charity's financial statements.

(a) Company Status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees.

(b) Basis of Preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and are prepared in compliance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities effective 1 January 2015, and the Companies Act 2006.

(c) Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor.

(d) Income and Expenditure

Income and Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Conference income and expenditure is recognised in the year the event was held.

Subscriptions are recorded on a receipts basis. The subscription period runs for one year from renewal/signing up date which may be at any time during the year. As the subscriptions are spread through the year no adjustment has been made for subscriptions in advance. Subscriptions are non-refundable.

(e) Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided using the reducing balance basis at rates which reflect the anticipated useful lives of the assets and their estimated residual values:

TO THE TRUSTEES OF
