Directors' report for the year ended 27 September 2009

The directors present their report together with the audited financial statements of the company for the year ended 27 September 2009 The company's registered number is 3440926

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company during the current and prior year comprised that of an intermediate holding company

Business review and future developments

The loss for the financial year amounted to £7,000 (2008 profit of £6,943,000) after receiving dividends from subsidiary undertakings of £nil (2008 £6,950,000). The directors are satisfied with the performance of the business in the year and believe that the financial position of the company at the year end is satisfactory. The directors do not anticipate a change in the company's activities.

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2008 £6,950 000)

Principal risks and uncertainties

The management of the business and the execution of the company's strategy are subject to a number of risks

The key business risks and uncertainties affecting the company are integrated with those of the group and are not identified separately. Further discussion of these risks and uncertainties and of future performance, in the context of the Southern Cross Healthcare Group PLC as a whole, is provided in the group's annual report which does not form part of this report.

Key performance indicators ('KPIs')

Given the straightforward nature of the business, the company's directors are of the opinion that analysis using KPIs is not necessary for an understanding of the development performance or position of the business. The development, performance and position of Southern Cross Healthcare Group PLC, which includes the company, is discussed in the group's annual report which does not form part of this report.

Financial risk management

The company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks market risk (including cash flow interest rate risk) and credit risk. Risk management is carried out by the Southern Cross Healthcare Group PLC Risk. Management Committee under policies approved by the board of directors.

Cash flow interest rate risk

The company's interest rate risk arises from intercompany borrowings and therefore the risk is considered minimal

Credit risk

Credit risk is managed on a group basis. Credit risk arises from cash and deposits with banks and financial institutions. For banks and financial institutions, only institutions with a short term credit rating, as determined by Moody's, of P-1 are accepted.

Consolidated accounts

The company is exempt under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertakings are included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of its parent, Southern Cross Healthcare Group PLC, a company registered in England and Wales

Other income

Other income relates to dividends received from subsidiary undertakings

Investments in subsidiary undertakings

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are stated at cost less provision for impairment. A provision is made for permanent diminution in value

Taxation

The current tax is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the income statement because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The company is liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been in force during the period.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash and balances in accounts at no or short notice

Finance costs

Finance costs consist of interest which is accrued on a time basis by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable
