#### Group Strategic Report for the year ended 31 March 2016

The directors present their strategic report of the company and the group for the year ended 31 March 2016.

The directors are satisfied with the group's performance for the year under review despite a challenging market environment. In addition, the board are optimistic of maximising returns following the introduction of a new print service department that expands the Trustco offering into new market segments.

The Group is pleased to receive an unqualified audit report on the 2016 financial statements which confirms that this strategic report is in line with the wider accounts and report for the year.

#### **REVIEW OF BUSINESS**

The parent company continues to cement it's focus on storage solutions by building strong networks and partnerships with key manufacturers to ensure that Trustco Plc remains ideally positioned to attract new business and enhance value within the existing client base.

Cloud operations have been restructured during the year to ensure the best mix of flexibility and control with the market responding well to our cloud service offering.

The board are happy with the staff recruitment drive which remains active. We have been working with new team members to ensure that they understand the business model and are fully trained in their approach.

The parent company has been rewarded with the ISO9001 accreditation again and feels it is important to show that we can be held accountable for the way we work internally and with our customers.

Software sales are steady and we continue to support a number of key vendors.

In house marketing remains a key focus with funds available for new data and involvement in IT related shows and events.

The main risk is the contracting hardware market with hardware requirements becoming fewer every day. With equipment becoming smaller, faster and more powerful customers are able to do more with less and make their assets last longer resulting in lower demand. The markets within which the company have historically operated are shrinking and changing. To minimise this risk the effects of a contracting market we have diversified into new business segments such as print services and working closer with backup and DR products.

#### **ASTOUND FACILITIES GROUP LIMITED**

Despite another challenging year for our subsidiary, the financial results continued to improve showing signs of increased efficiency in the business operations. Further developments on key areas of the company's operating system and strong relationships with customers will assist the company to a position of profitability. Greater focus on segments with greater profit margins will set us in good stead for the foreseeable future.

# Notes to the Consolidated Financial Statements for the year ended 31 March 2016

#### 1. COMPANY INFORMATION

The company was incorporated on 5th December 1997 and is a public, unlisted company registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number is 03476994 and the principal place of business is 12 Riverside Business Centre, Shoreham by Sea, BN43 6RE.

The principal activities of the company in the year under review were the supply of IT hardware, software, storage, virtualisation and associated services.

#### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

This is the first year in which the financial statements have been prepared under FRS 102. Refer to note 30 for an explanation of the transition.

These financial statements are presented in the currency of the primary economic environment in which the entity operates (its functional currency). For the purpose of these financial statements, the results and financial position are presented in Sterling (£).

#### **Basis of consolidation**

The Group financial statements incorporate the financial statements of the company and entities controlled by the company (its subsidiaries) made up to 31 March 2016. Control is achieved where the company has the power to govern the financial and operating policies of an investee entity so as to obtain benefits from its activities.

The results of subsidiaries acquired or disposed of during the period are included in the Consolidated Profit and Loss Account from the effective date of acquisition or up to the effective date of disposal, as appropriate.

Where necessary, adjustments are made to the financial statements of subsidiaries to bring the accounting policies used into line with those used by the Group. All intra-Group transactions, balances, income and expenses are eliminated on consolidation.

#### Significant judgements and estimates

Preparation of the financial statements requires management to make significant judgements and estimates. The items in the financial statements where these judgements and estimates have been made include assessing the value of Goodwill to establish whether an impairment is appropriate. This assessment is supported by a valuation method of using the discounted future cash flows of the underlying trade..

# Notes to the Consolidated Financial Statements - continued for the year ended 31 March 2016

#### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### **Turnover**

Turnover includes revenue earned from the sale of goods and from the rendering of services stated after trade discounts, other sales related taxes and net of VAT.

Turnover from the sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods has transferred to the buyer. This is usually at the point that the customer has signed for the delivery of the goods.

Turnover from the rendering of services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs. Turnover is only recognised to the extent of recoverable expenses when the outcome of a contract cannot be estimated reliably.

#### Goodwill

Goodwill, being the amount paid in connection with the acquisition of a business in 2014, is being amortised evenly over its estimated useful life of ten years.

In addition to amortisation, goodwill is also subject to provision for impairment where there is evidence that it's carrying value is overstated.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - 25% on cost Fixtures and fittings - 25% on cost Motor vehicles - 25% on cost Computer equipment - 25% on cost

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment.

#### **Investment property**

Investment property is carried at fair value. Revaluation surpluses are recognised in the income statement. Deferred taxation is provided on these gains at the rate expected to apply when the property is sold.

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Stock cost is calculated using the first in first out method.

#### Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date. A deferred tax asset is only recognised where it is more likely than not that the asset will be recoverable in the foreseeable future out of suitable taxable profits from which the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

#### Research and development

Expenditure on research and development is written off in the year in which it is incurred. Development costs relate to specific projects utilising technical knowledge to enhance the company's range of products and services.

#### 2. **ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued**

#### Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the statement of financial position date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

#### **Operating leases**

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

The aggregate benefit of lease incentives are recognised as a reduction to the expense recognised over the lease term on a straight line basis.

#### Investments

Investments comprise investments in unquoted equity instruments which are measured at fair value. Changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss. Fair value is estimated by using an appropriate valuation technique.

#### **Invoice discounting**

Amounts due in respect of invoice discounting are disclosed within bank loans and overdrafts as current liabilities. The company can use these facilities to draw down a percentage of the value of certain sales invoices. The management and collection of trade debtors remains with the company.

#### Going concern

Notwithstanding the company's net current liabilities at 31 March 2016, these financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the directors are satisfied that the company will have adequate resources and the continuing support provided by the ultimate controlling parties to meet it's financial obligations as they fall due for a period of at least 12 months from when these financial statements are approved.

#### **TURNOVER** 3.
