Responsibilities of the directors

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company as at the end of the financial period and of the surplus or deficit of the charitable company for that period. I report on the accounts of the Trust for the year ended 31st January 2006, which are set out on pages 3 to 5.
