#### THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

#### PERIOD FROM 29th MAY 2005 TO 31st MAY 2006

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the period from 29th May 2005 to 31st May 2006

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activities of the company during the period were the operation of 2 restaurants and development of restaurants under management contracts and franchise agreements

The directors are disappointed with the loss made in this period and the subsequent period. The directors are pleased with progress made in the development of the financial performance of the restaurants and are confident of their future growth

The shareholders have agreed to sell the company to Tasameem Real Estate Company LLC, subject to vanous conditions. The directors believe that the sale will be completed and that the bank borrowings and shareholder loans referred to in notes 17 and 18 to the financial statements will be repaid in full

#### **Financial Key Performance Indicators**

Turnover, percent increase in turnover, and gross margin (defined as gross profit divided by turnover expressed as a percentage) are the key measure of financial performance in the company, and are as follows

#### **RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS**

The loss for the period, after taxation, amounted to £211,016. The directors have not recommended a dividend

#### FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The company's principal financial instruments comprise bank balances, bank overdrafts, bank loans, trade creditors, loans to the company by shareholders and finance lease agreements. The main purpose of these instruments is to raise funds for the company's operations and to finance the company's operations.

In respect of bank balances the liquidity risks are managed by maintaining a balance between the continuity of funding and flexibility through use of loans from banks and shareholders. The company makes use of money market facilities where funds are available

#### THE DIRECTORS' REPORT (continued)

#### PERIOD FROM 29th MAY 2005 TO 31st MAY 2006

In respect of loans, these comprise loans from both the bank and from shareholders. The company manages this liquidity risk by ensuring there are sufficient funds to meet its payments. The directors are aware of the company's required finance seeking to ensure that loans will only be repaid, in whole or in part, when alternative finance is available. As noted above the directors expect the company to be sold to a new shareholder which they expect will refinance the existing bank and shareholder loans.

The company is a lessee in respect of finance lease assets. The liquidity risk in respect of these is managed in the same way as loans above.

Trade creditors liquidity risk is managed by ensuring sufficient funds are available to meet amounts due

#### **OPINION: DISCLAIMER ON VIEW GIVEN BY THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

In forming our opinion on the financial statements, we have considered the adequacy of the disclosures made in the financial statements concerning the following material matters

- note 1, which describes the uncertainty regarding the company's ability to continue as a going concern. This is dependent on the completion of the planned sale of the company and the provision of financial support from the company's new parent company, or on the continuing support of the current lenders and shareholders in the event the sale does not complete.
- note 22, which describes the company's contingent liability in respect of £1 8million of PAYE and NI liabilities (excluding any interest and penalties) which HMRC are claiming are due. The company is disputing that any material payment is due and this has therefore not been provided in the accounts.

Because of the potential significance, to the financial statements, of the combined effect of the two matters referred to in the paragraph above, we are unable to form an opinion as to whether the financial statements

- give a true and fair view, in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice, of the state of the company's affairs as at 31st May 2006 and of its loss for the year then ended, and
- have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985

Notwithstanding our disclaimer on the view given by the financial statements, in our opinion the information given in the Directors' Report is consistent with the financial statements

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention

Comparative figures are in respect of the period from 31st May 2004 to 28th May 2005

#### **Going Concern**

During the period the company made an operating profit of £317,783 and a retained loss after interest and tax of £211,016. However, the balance sheet showed a deficiency on current assets of £3,420,719 and on total assets of £3,815,078. The accounts to 2nd June 2007 show further post-tax losses of £213,027.

Since the period end, the company's bank borrowings have become due on demand as the banking covenants were breached. Furthermore, the company has a potentially significant contingent liability, as disclosed in note 22, which could materially increase the company's liabilities if it were to crystallise.

Accordingly the company is reliant on the provision of continuing financial support from its lenders and shareholders. The shareholders have agreed to sell the company to Tasameem Real Estate Company LLC, subject to various conditions. The directors believe the sale will be completed and that the bank borrowings and shareholders loans disclosed in notes 17 and 18 being repaid in full. The new shareholders have confirmed that if the sale is completed they will provide sufficient financial support for the foreseeable future, which is defined as twelve months from the date of approval of the financial statements.

The directors have considered the situation and have concluded that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis. However there is no certainty that the planned sale will complete or that the new shareholder will provide the necessary support, or in the event that the sale is not completed whether the current lenders and shareholders will continue to provide the necessary support. No adjustments have been recorded that would be required in the event that the company ceased to be a going concern

#### Turnover

Turnover is the value of goods and services, exclusive of Value Added Tax, provided to customers during the period

#### Other operating income

Initial franchise and technical assistance fees are recognised over the period from date of signing the Franchise agreement to the expected opening date of the restaurant. Income invoiced in advance is carried forward in the Balance Sheet under deferred income and is offset by the revenue recorded as the franchise income is recognised.

Royalty fee income is recognised on an accruals basis, as a percentage of turnover reported by the restaurant

#### Amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

#### **Stocks**

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items

#### Hire purchase agreements

Assets held under hire purchase agreements are capitalised and disclosed under tangible fixed assets at their fair value. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability and the interest is charged to the profit and loss account at a constant rate of charge on the balance of capital repayments outstanding.

#### Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

#### **Deferred taxation**

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions

Provision is made for tax on gains ansing from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

#### Consolidation

In the opinion of the directors, the company and its subsidiary undertaking comprise a medium sized group. The company has therefore taken advantage of the exemption provided by Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare group accounts and thus the accounts show information about the company as an individual entity.

HM Revenue & Customs has claimed that the company's tronc system for the allocation of customer gratuities to staff has not been administered in a way that would have avoided any liability for the company to pay national insurance contributions on amounts distributed.
