### FRIENDS FOR LEISURE A COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2020

This year has been another successful year for Friends for Leisure. Small charities have continued to find it difficult to attract funding, maintain services at their previous standard and retain and reward staff. We have again been lucky to retain a very special and loyal team.

We again received funding from Cheshire East Council through both their Short Breaks for Disabled Children contract and their New Homes Bonus Scheme. Other important sources of income have been received from BBC Children in Need, The Steve Morgan Foundation, St James's Place Foundation, Cheadle Royal Hospital, Cheshire Community Foundation (iWill Fund), The Russell Trust, The Sobell Foundation and The True Colours Trust.

Prism have continued to give IT support which has been invaluable and Thrive Creative have been a great help with regard to marketing the charity. We have also received business support from MOTO at Knutsford Service Station and the Co-Op in Congleton

The general financial status of the charity remains steady. Income received totalled £163,861 and expenditure amounted to £171,761. This left the charity with unrestricted reserves of £92,343 thus allowing the charity to maintain running costs in accordance with the policy of the charity of about six months.

The total number of new young people registered amounted to 44, with 281 young people registered at the year end. As of year-end there were 60 young people on our waiting list for one to one friendships. We maintained 30 friendship links and 4buddy links during the year as well as holding 17 link meetings. There were 49 new volunteers joining us during the year and as always the ability of the charity to continue to attract young volunteers has been a vital part of the running of the charity.

Activities included Crewe Youth Group, Macclesfield Youth Group, Crewe Juniors, CYG Congleton, 15 UP Congleton, drama at Macclesfield, Saturday Club at Crewe, bowling at Macclesfield and in the summer holidays there were visits to a picnic in the park, Friends for Leisure Fiesta, POUND work out, brunch at The Pavilion, Which Craft workshop, bowling and burger, Junk art creations, the Film Club and PT in the Park

As always, our gratitude should be noted to Gillian and the staff for their efforts during the course of the year.

### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### **Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements**

The accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with FRS102. The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard).

### **Company Status**

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. If the charity is dissolved the trustees/members must contribute such sum (not exceeding £10 each) as may be demanded of them towards payment of the debts and liabilities of the charity.

### **Fund Accounting**

Unrestricted Funds are funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated Funds are funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted funds for specific future purposes or projects. Any amounts not utilised are carried forward where the specific purpose or project remains part of the charity's objectives.

Restricted Funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund.

### , Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are recognised once the charity has entitlement to the resources, it is certain that the resources will be received, and the monetary value of incoming resources can be measured with sufficient reliability.

### **Resources Expended**

Resources expended are allocated to the particular activities to which they relate. Governance costs are those incurred in connection with the administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

### **Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation**

The trustees have reviewed the company's fixed asset capitalisation and depreciation policies. Assets such as office equipment are not considered to have any realisable value and the capitalisation thereof only serves to overstate the funds available for the beneficiaries of Friends For Leisure.

Accordingly, these assets have been written off in the year of acquisition.

### **Taxation**

The company is exempt from any corporation tax liability due to its charitable status.
