NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2011

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of freehold land and buildings

At 30 April 2011 the company had net current liabilities of £1,043,392 (2010 £1,062,773) In the opinion of the directors the financial statements have been properly prepared on the going concern basis which is dependent on the continued financial support of the group companies

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a subsidiary undertaking where 90 percent or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

13 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for services net of trade discounts

14 Goodwill

Goodwill, being the amount paid in connection with the acquisition of a business in 1998, is being written off evenly over its estimated useful economic life of ten years

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows.

Land and buildings Freehold

1% on straight line basis

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

25% on reducing balance basis

1.6 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value

17 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees. Contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account in the year they are payable.

18 Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. Recognition of deferred tax asset is limited to the extent that the company anticipates making sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing difference. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted.

19 Period of account

The financial statements are in respect of the year ended 30 April 2011. The comparative figures are for the period from 1 November 2008 to 30 April 2010.
