Report of the Trustees for the year ended 30 June 2020

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Emmaus Preston provides a home, work training and development for people who have been homeless or socially excluded. People who become homeless do so for a variety of complex reasons. Many of the community members have slept rough. Emmaus offers stability, companionship, support and security for people to rebuild their lives. Accommodation is available for 26 people in the Community Home.

The Community is fully inclusive. Companions are encouraged to play an active role in the day to day running of the Community.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

We have accommodation for up to 26 formerly homeless people, whom we call Companions, in our house on Ribbleton Lane. This is supported by our three retail outlets in Preston including our town centre store in Preston and the largest charity store in the country which we opened in September 2016 a former B& Q. Most of our costs are paid for through our own social enterprises which are run by our Companions with support from a small staff team.

Emmaus Preston currently supports Emmaus Burnley under a Joint Working Agreement which commenced in July 2016. This agreement means a small number of Emmaus Preston staff and Trustees are shared with Emmaus Burnley.

Companions

The year started well with almost a full house of Companions and we remained almost full for the entire year. Despite Companions moving on there was demand, albeit not always locally, for our services and so rooms were never empty for long. Companions have achieved a wide range of training outcomes including NVQ Level 2 in Warehousing and Storage, First Aid at Work, Confidence Building, Food Hygiene and the CSCS Card.

It was pleasing to see Companions represent us quarterly at the National Companion Forum where they had a voice and inputted into the 2020 - 2025 Emmaus National Strategy.

From July - February we saw a number of companions move into paid employment and their own accommodation and it will be a focus of future staff roles to ensure that external work experience, different types of work experience within our Emmaus and future housing options are explored and Companions supported into these.

Emmaus Preston is a very stable community and Companions enjoy the work they do, feel supported and the majority have a focus on the future outside of Emmaus.

Companion's activities including Go Karting, Quizzes, Bingo, Treasure Hunts and Meals out and our Activity Committee continues to look at joint social activities for our Companions.

Business

The Social Enterprises we run, mainly retail, support the running costs of our Emmaus including paying for food, support, training courses, move-on and some of the accommodation costs of our Companions. The more money we can generate the more support we can offer to Companions and our Companions are proud that as a charity we do not chase grants and are predominantly self-funding through our own work.

This financial year we would have produced our most income from our social enterprises ever but with our shops shut for two weeks before the official lockdown in mid-March 2020, due to our Companions having Covid symptoms, and then not re-opening until mid-June 2020 we took a huge financial hit in retail.

We started the financial year well with internal retail training for all and a big clean-up of the garden and outer areas at our Megastore to try and improve the area and indeed sales within our store. We are stocking a wider range of new goods within our stores and creating a new bed area in our main Megastore this has seen us attract new customers.

In September we did a refit of our town centre store, supported by Mark Johnson from Emmaus UK, to bring a better clothing offer in to the store and catch trade from browsers more likely looking at lower value items.

Emmaus Preston proudly hosted the Business Manager meeting for all Emmaus with twenty attendees with us for two days to learn about how we operate and meet some of the suppliers we purchase from to re-sell in stores.

We looked to increase our cycle workshops and offer volunteering opportunities within it, but combining with a former NHS cycle repair facility in Ribbleton did not follow through and instead we paid for four more of our own Companions to complete the City and Guilds in Cycle Mechanics.

We understand we need to diversify our social enterprises and are looking at other options as well as new ways of retailing including Ecommerce which we will launch next year.

A successful start in every way for Emmaus Preston until we hit March 2020 and the Global Pandemic stopped our retail stores, stopped a number of the training courses we run and stopped a lot of the move on and job options for our Companions. Like our Companions, some who lived of years on the streets and had a range of issues, we will deal with what comes at us, prioritise supporting the people we work with to improve their lives and adapt into 2021 and beyond. We aim to help more people, do more locally and to do this generate more income to ensure a strong Emmaus Preston offers the services that we know can make a difference.

We thank our Companions, volunteers, supporters both business and local people, Trustees and staff for their hard work and endeavours in the year and hope they are up for it again next year.

The Effect of Covid

Sales were £104,000 below expectation. There was no saving in rates as our shops have applied for rebates due to our charitable status. We only received one government grant of £25,000 as the other two shops did not qualify. We also received a £5,268 grant from Emmaus UK. We received £8,459 for staff that were furloughed.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The reserve policy is kept under review by trustees.

In line with advice from Emmaus UK we at least hold the equivalent of three months costs in reserves to cover overheads in event of closure.

The landlord of our main outlet anticipates that he will redevelop it in the near future and we hold a reserve to cover the cost of removal.

The proceeds of the sale of a property previously rented out are to be used on a long term project to teach companions useful skills in building and property maintenance.

Grants received totalled £3,420 (2019: £7,350) and Gifts and Donations totalled £36,239 (2019: £10,486).

Rents and Housing Benefits were £139,588 (2019: £127,461).

The net movement in funds was £21,515 (2019: £21,673).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Charity was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 2 October 1998. The company's Memorandum of Association established its objectives and powers and it is governed under its Articles of Association. The directors of Emmaus Preston are also the Trustees for the purpose of Charity law. In the event of the company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Induction and training of new trustees

Each new Trustee is briefed about the Community, their legal responsibilities and ethical responsibilities and an induction programme is in place which included visiting other communities and attending Emmaus UK Federation induction day. Periodic appraisals are undertaken of trustee's skills and suitable training is offered.

Related parties

Emmaus Preston is a member of the Emmaus Federation in the UK. Emmaus UK is a federation of all the Emmaus Groups and Communities in the UK.

Emmaus Preston's Chair, Director and Community manager participate in Federation peer group meetings where best practice is shared. Emmaus Preston receives support from the Federation staff on recruitment, training, publicity, policy development, best practice and fund raising.

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The charity is a registered charity in England and Wales and is incorporated. The address of the principal office is The Birches, 165 Ribbleton Lane, Preston, Lancashire, PR1 5ST.

There are no material uncertanties about the charity's ability to continue.

The presentational currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

The amounts in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest £1.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold land - nil

Freehold buildings - 2% on cost
Plant and machinery - 25% on cost
Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 20% - 33% on cost
Motor vehicles - 33% on cost

Fixed asset investments

Listed investments are valued at their mid market price as at the close of trading at the year end date.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised when the company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Basic financial assets, which include debtors, prepayments and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price and are subsequently carried at cost unless the arrangement indicates otherwise and then the asset is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Basic financial liabilities, which include creditors, accruals, bank loans and group borrowings, are initially recognised at transaction price and are subsequently carried at cost unless the arrangement indicates otherwise and then the liability is measured at the present value of the future obligations discounted at a market rate of interest.
