#### Directors' Report for the year ended 3 April 2016

#### **Principal activity**

The principal activity of the company is that of an investment holding company. The Board does not envisage any major changes to the company's activity in the foreseeable future.

#### Going concern

The Company's intermediate parent undertaking, Guardian Media Group plc, is owned 100% by The Scott Trust Limited, whose core purpose is to secure the financial and editorial independence of The Guardian in perpetuity. The directors believe that the Company has adequate resources to continue operations for the foreseeable future and confirmation has been received from Guardian Media Group plc that it will provide financing facilities to enable the Company to carry on its business as a going concern. For this reason, the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements continues to be appropriate.

#### **Directors' liabilities**

As permitted by the Articles of Association, the Directors have the benefit of an indemnity which is a qualifying third party indemnity provision as defined by Section 234 of the Companies Act 2006. The indemnity was in force throughout the last financial year and is currently in force. The Company also purchased and maintained throughout the financial year Directors' and Officers' liability insurance in respect of itself and its Directors.

#### Disclosure of information to the auditors

Each director has taken steps that they ought to have taken as a director in order to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information. #### 1 General information

The company is a private company limited by share capital incorporated and domiciled in United Kingdom.

The address of its registered office is: PO Box 68164 Kings Place 90 York Way London N1P 2AP

These financial statements were authorised for issue by the Board on 29 June 2016.

#### 2 Accounting policies

#### Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

#### **Basis of preparation**

The company has transitioned to Financial Reporting Standard 101, 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' (FRS 101) from the previously extant UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice for all periods presented. Transition tables showing all material adjustments are disclosed in note 11.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements of the company are made up to the Sunday closest to 31 March each year. Consequently, the financial statements for the current period cover the 53 weeks ended 3 April 2016 and for the comparative period cover the 52 weeks ended 29 March 2015.

#### Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 3 April 2016

#### **Summary of disclosure exemptions**

The following exemptions from the requirements of IFRS have been applied in the preparation of these financial statements, in accordance with FRS 101:

- IAS 1 'Presentation of financial statements': information on management of capital has not been presented. Comparative financial information in respect of paragraph 73 (E) of IAS 16 Property, plant and equipment and paragraph 11 (e) of IAS 38 Intangible assets has not been presented.
- IAS 7 'Statement of cash flows': A cash flow statement has not been presented.
- IAS 8 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors': Disclosure in respect of new standards and interpretations that have been issued but which are not yet effective has not been provided.
- IAS 24 'Related party disclosures': Key Management personnel compensation has note been presented. Related party transactions entered into between two or more members of the group, provided that the subsidiary which is a party to the transaction is wholly owned by such a member have not been disclosed.
- IFRS 7 'Financial instruments: Disclosures': None of the disclosures required by IFRS 7 have been presented.
- IFRS 13 'Fair value measurement': None of the disclosures required by IFRS 13 have been presented.

#### Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

#### Changes in accounting policy

None of the standards, interpretations and amendments effective for the first time from 30 March 2015 have had a material effect on the financial statements.

#### Tax

The tax expense for the period comprises current tax. Tax is recognised in profit or loss, except that a change attributable to an item of income or expense recognised as other comprehensive income is also recognised directly in other comprehensive income.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the company operates and generates taxable income.

#### **Investments**

Investments in securities are classified on initial recognition as available-for-sale and are carried at fair value, except where their fair value cannot be measured reliably, in which case they are carried at cost, less any impairment.

Unrealised holding gains and losses other than impairments are recognised in other comprehensive income. On maturity or disposal, net gains and losses previously deferred in accumulated other comprehensive income are recognised in income.

Interest income on debt securities, where applicable, is recognised in income using the effective interest method. Dividends on equity securities are recognised in income when receivable.

## Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 3 April 2016

#### Trade payables

Trade payables are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less (or in the normal operating cycle of the business if longer). If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities.

Trade payables are recognised initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

#### Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Equity instruments are measured at the fair value of the cash or other resources received or receivable, net of the direct costs of issuing the equity instruments. If payment is deferred and the time value of money is material, the initial measurement is on a present value basis.
