REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the year ended 31 December 2000

STATEMENT OF AIMS

The aim of the charity is to improve patient care through;

1.enhancing the ethical and communication skills of health professionals; and

2.developing effective ways in which organisations involved in the delivery of health care can promote high ethical standards.

OPERATING POLICY

In order to achieve this aim, the Ethox Foundation focuses on three areas of activity:

- 1. The development and delivery of undergraduate and postgraduate education and training with the object of equipping health professionals to care for the whole patient.
- 2. Research into a range of key ethical and communication issues which affect the practice of medicine.
- 3. Working with both the purchasers and providers of health care in establishing clinical ethics consultation services including clinical ethics committees.

In pursuit of these aims the Ethox Foundation has powers to employ its own staff on a full or part time basis; to engage consultants; to make grants to universities and other educational institutions; plan and manage training courses, seminars, etc. alone or in collaboration with other bodies, and to provide support facilities for scholars working in the foundation's area of interest.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

The charity is managed by the trustees with the support of an administrator. Professor Tony Hope, Professor of Medical Ethics in the University of Oxford and Director of the Ethox Centre in the Department of Primary Care acts as Advisor to the Ethox Foundation.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

During the year grants totaling £60,000 were received from the Dulverton Trust - for further work in developing the teaching of communication skills – and the Kathleen Hannay Memorial Charity. Bank interest and course fees generated £28,084 and £4,531 respectively.

Grants made during the year included:

- Support for a visiting fellow from Northwestern University Medical School, Chicago.
- Support for overseas speakers at the International Association of Bioethics Conference held in Bristol during September 2000.

Other expenditure included:

- Continuing grant to the University of Oxford to fund a lectureship in medical ethics (running to 31 May 2002).
- Contribution to Dr Mary Nichols to enable her to complete a project assessing the effectiveness of communication in general practice.
- Administrator's salary (running to 31 December 2001) and office support costs.
- Professional fees for course development work (running to 17 October 2001).

FINANCIAL POSITION

The charity had a healthy position at 31 December 2000, with £453,000 being held on deposit. The trustees regularly forecast income and expenditure, and they believe that the present position plus planned fund raising will enable them to expand the charity's activities and meet its aims for the foreseeable future.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing financial statements giving a true and fair view, the trustees should follow best practice and

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the compan will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ascertain the financial position of the charity and to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

AUDITORS

The auditors, Camerons, Chartered Accountants, will be proposed for re-appointment in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and are in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 2000) and the Charities Accounting Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP).

Income

All grants and voluntary income are accounted for gross when receivable, as long as they are capable of financial measurement. This includes gifts in kind, included at estimated valuation.

Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets are included at cost. There are no uncapitalised fixed assets.

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Office equipment - 25% on reducing balance Fixtures and fittings - 20% on reducing balance Web site - 25% on reducing balance

Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for gross, and when incurred.

Direct charitable expenditure includes the direct costs of the activities and depreciation on related assets.

Support costs comprise service costs incurred centrally in support of the project work.

Grants payable

Grants payable are recognised as expenditure when the commitment is entered into. Where such a grant is to be paid over installments, the outstanding balance is disclosed as a liability.
