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Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2015.

Principal activities

The company was the holding vehicle for the re-development of the Festival Garden site in Liverpool which was sold to Liverpool City Council in June 2015. During the company's ownership of the property since 2005 planning permission for 1,374 homes has been obtained, funding to restore and maintain the gardens has been secured and the restoration works have been organised and carried out.

Business review

The severe economic consequences of the recession on the value of the development land resulted in the company writing down its £18,500,000 investment in the Festival Gardens to £2,000,000 in June 2012. As the economy recovered the company appraised the residual land value and agreed to revise it to £5,810,000 in September 2014.

The company's profit for the year before taxation amounted to £3,997,479 (2014: loss before taxation of £3,485) which was transferred to reserves and reduced the profit and loss account reserve to a loss of £10,503,000. (2014: loss of £14,501,000)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards and using the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, are set out below.

Under FRS1 (revised 1996), the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cashflow statement on the grounds of its size.

Going concern

Notwithstanding the deficiency on shareholders' funds the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. The company has funding provided by its parent company, Network Space Developments Ltd.

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and accounts.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. For work in progress relating to developments, cost is taken as direct cost plus an appropriate proportion of production and other site overheads.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the loss for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Except where otherwise required by accounting standards, full provision without discounting is made for all timing differences, which have arisen but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Related parties

Under the provisions of FRS 8 the company is exempt from the requirement to disclose details of transactions with group companies.
