Report of the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors submit their report and the unaudited accounts for the year ended 31st May 2001.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the company is to use multimedia to develop and produce fully accessible and multi sensory art works, provided via exhibitions, meetings, lectures, classes, conferences, seminars and performances.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

We are pleased to be able to write our second directors report for what has been another successful year for Fittings MultiMedia Arts both in terms of quality of artistic product and the continued progress in establishing the company on a firm organisational and financial base.

The main piece of work produced in this financial year was a world premier, being the first stage version of the old horror classic "The Fly" at The Royal Exchange Studio. This was virtually a complete sell out and gained a very favourable audience response contributing to FMA's growing reputation as innovators in developing new mixed media integrated performance and artworks.

The work also increased the range of our collaborators as we negotiated the rights for the book with West End Producer Paul Farrah, whose company generously allowed these for free as well as offering invaluable support and advice re marketing and development. We continued and enhanced our relationship with writer Mike Kenny who adapted the book and established a strong working relationship with young Manchester based graphic designer Paul Heaton.

We also offered an education package with the show which brought a lot of young people into the theatre. The whole process was documented and evaluated by local arts consultant Richard Cragg that we will use to make application for organisational development funding.

Other work included collaboration with New Breed and Contact Theatre directing and designing a build a performance fortnight with local disabled actors "So Here It Is". We also continued our relationship with DASH (Disability Arts Shropshire) designing, producing and documenting a major celebration of Disability Art in their region SMAC 2k including the commissioning of 5 new performance works two of which were directed by one of our Artistic Directors.

We continued to have a very fruitful relationship with North West Arts Board and in particular our lead officer Maureen Jordan and our value to the arts world of the North West was formally recognised when we were chosen as one of the companies to receive funding from the National Theatre Review. The company was notified that it would receive retainers for 2000/2001 and 2001/2002 with substantial core funding being put in place from 2003. This formal recognition of the companies work provided a very happy ending to what has been an immensely productive year for the Fittings MultiMedia Arts.
