NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2005

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of freehold land and buildings held as stock and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005).

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable from the sale of property and all other property related income.

1.4 Stock

Stock of property is shown at replacement cost in line with the alternative accounting rules embodied in the Companies Act 1985.

1.5 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at appropriate rates on all timing differences using the liability method only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

2 Debtors

Debtors include an amount of £252,025 (2004 - £-) which is due after more than one year.

3 Creditors: amounts falling due after more than one year

The aggregate amount of creditors for which security has been given amounted to £1,392,411 (2004 - £1,124,486).
