Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The charity's objectives are as follows:

- To advance training for employment
- The advancement of education
- To relieve poverty
- To promote race relations

The policies adopted in furtherance of these objects are to provide affordable commercial premises for rent to newly established small businesses at the charity's purposes build micro business park and there have been no changes to these during the year.

To maximise capacity and rental income recoverable throughout the year.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The letting of the units are at full capacity and education facilities are used in full.

One unit, was charitably donated rent free to the Banglatown Tenants Association (BTA) for the full year, waiving the rent of £14,400 and Service Charge of £3,280, along with which the charity paid the associated utility costs of £2,827. In total the charity has given support to the BTA of £20,508 in kind

The main hall was provided to the Parent Advice Centre to carry out their activities on a monthly basis. This was provided on a rent free basis which would have ordinarily been charged out at £3,600 per annum.

In addition to this, the hall was also provided to the Supplementary School to carry out its activities on a rent free basis. We would ordinarily charge £10,000 per annum for use of this facility.

Additionally the Charity funded two teachers for the financial year at £9,359 each, which totals £18,719 for the pair.

In total the Charity has funded charitable donations in cash and in kind of £52,826.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity received income of £162,954 (2017: £170,046) during the year. After payment of outgoing expenses of £178,569 (2017: £154,992), the charity was left with a deficit of £15,615 (surplus of 2017: £15,054) for the year.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
