ENQUIRIES AND INVESTIGATIONS

Shortly after appointment, the Liquidator undertook a review of all the information available and conducted an initial assessment of whether there were any matters which may have led to any recoveries for the benefit of creditors.

No further assets or actions that might lead to a recovery for creditors were identified.

REALISATION OF ASSETS

Detailed below is key information about asset realisation and strategy, however, more details about the work undertaken may be found at Appendix III. The Joint Liquidators formulated and worked through a realisation strategy that sought to maximise realisations net of costs. The financial benefit of those efforts is described further below.

Book debts

There were still a number of book debts left uncollected from the Administration period, all of which were in dispute. No further realisations were made.

Administration Estate Surplus

The Administration estate held a surplus of cash, and this was paid across the liquidation estate.

VAT Refund

There were some funds owing to the Company through a VAT refund for supplies made during the Administration period. These were recovered into the liquidation estate.

General Refund

HSBC issued the Company with a refund of £87.

The Joint Liquidators have met their statutory and regulatory duties to report to creditors, as listed below. In consideration of the need for transparency and engagement with creditors, care has been taken to ensure that reports and other communications with creditors have provided useful details of the strategies pursued and the outcomes anticipated.

- Final Report.

Secured creditors

The Company had granted a fixed charge to Lloyds Bank plc, but this was settled as part of the Administration estate and, therefore, in the liquidation estate, not security remained in place.

Preferential creditors

Employee claims

There were a number of legacy claims from the Administration estate but these claims, although agreed, have not received a distribution due to the lack of realisations.

Unsecured creditors

There were insufficient funds to make a distribution to unsecured creditors.

Dividends

There is no prospect of a distribution to the any class of creditors in this matter.

ETHICS

Please also be advised that Liquidator is bound by the Insolvency Code of Ethics when carrying out all professional work relating to an insolvency appointment.

General ethical considerations

In the period since the last report, no new threats to compliance with the Code of Ethics were identified.

Specialist Advice and Services

When instructing third parties to provide specialist advice and services or having the specialist services provided by the firm, the Liquidator is obligated to ensure that such advice or work is warranted and that the advice or work contracted reflects the best value and service for the work undertaken. The firm reviews annually the specialists available to provide services within each specialist area and the cost of those services to ensure best value. The specialists chosen usually have knowledge specific to the insolvency industry and, where relevant, to matters specific to this insolvency appointment. Details of the specialists specifically chosen in this matter are detailed below

FEES AND EXPENSES

The Joint Liquidators' fees

It is the firm's practice to ensure that work is conducted and charged at the appropriate level. Day to day administration on cases is charged at an Administrators rate. Where the issues are complex and litigious, the work will be charged at either a Manager or Partner / Insolvency Practitioner rate.

The basis of the Joint Liquidators' fees was approved by creditors through the Administrator Proposals with a maximum fee of £10,000 to be charged against the liquidation estate. The following resolution was passed in accordance with the Administrators Proposals:

"THAT the basis of the Joint Liquidators' fees be fixed by reference to the time properly given by the Joint Liquidators and their staff in attending to matters as set out in the fees estimate, such time to be charged at the prevailing standard hourly charge out rates used by the firm at the time when the work is performed."

The time costs for the period 7 June 2021 to 2 December 2021 total £2566.50, representing 8.70 hours at an average hourly rate of £295. The sum of £9,742 has been drawn on account of time costs incurred. The time costs for the period are detailed at Appendix IV.

The total time costs during the period of appointment amount to £10,873.50 representing 39.10 hours at an average hourly rate of £278.09 and a comparison between the original estimate and time costs to date is given at Appendix V.

Having regard for the costs that are likely to be incurred in bringing this Liquidation to a close, the Joint Liquidators consider that:

- · the original fees estimate is unlikely to be exceeded; and
- the original expenses estimate is unlikely to be exceeded.
