NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The full financial statements, from which these abbreviated accounts have been extracted, have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

1.2 Cash flow

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company

1.3 Turnover and investments

Turnover comprises the company's share of profits and losses in the investment, in which it acts as a limited partner. The share of profits and losses is recognised at the rate they are earned by the investment. The company does not exert any control over the investment's activities and in determining the limited partnership's policy of remitting surpluses. Earnings in excess of amounts remitted are included in the carrying value of investments. Where the carrying value of investments thus derived is in excess of the recoverable amount a provision for impairment in value is made. The cost of the capital invested in the company's investment is carried at its historic cost amount, less any provision for impairment required.

1.4 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

1.5 Foreign currencles

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into dollars at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into dollars at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the Profit and Loss Account
