The directors present their report and accounts for the year ended 31st March 2005.

The assets and liabilities of e-Ware Interactive Limited were transferred to GB Group plc on 31 March 2005. Thereafter, e-Ware Interactive Limited ceased trading and remains a dormant subsidiary of GB Group plc.

Results and Dividends

The company reports a profit of £131,904 for the year ended 31 March 2005, as shown in the profit and loss account. No dividends were declared.

Principal Activities and Review of Business

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of provision of software and services. Following the transfer of its trade, assets and liabilities to GB Group plc on 31 March 2005, the company was made dormant and has remained so thereafter.

There have been no post balance sheet events.

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Political and Charitable donations

During the period there were no payments of a charitable nature. There were no contributions to political organisations.

Directors and their interests

As at 31 March 2005, the director of the company held no beneficial interests in the shares of the company. The interests of RA Law in the share capital of the parent company, GB Group plc, are disclosed in the accounts of that company.

1. Principal Accounting Policies

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis due to the continuing support of the ultimate parent undertaking, GB Group plc.

Turnover

Turnover is stated net of value added tax. Turnover and operating profit arise in the United Kingdom.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life as follows:

Computer equipment

25% per annum on a straight line basis

Fixtures & fittings

25% per annum on a straight line basis

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Deferred Taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax in future or a right to pay less tax, with the following exception:

Deferred tax assets are recognised only if it is considered more likely than not that there will be suitable
profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Cashflow statements

The company has taken advantage of the exemption conferred on wholly owned subsidiary undertakings by Financial Reporting Standard No.1 (Revised) on the requirement to present a statement of cashflows.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight-line basis over the lease term.
