STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Arun Co-Ordinated Community Transport is a company limited by guarantee and a registered charity governed by its memorandum and articles of association dated 9 March 2000.

Appointment of trustees

Management committee members are elected individually at the Annual General Meeting. The management committee have the power to co-opt up to two further persons.

Induction and training of new trustees

New trustees are given the publications titled 'The Essential Trustee - what you need to know' and 'The Essential Trustee - an introduction' (Updated July 2015) as issued by the Charity Commission. They are also required to attend an induction at the charity's premises at a convenient date & time.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Organisation

The management committee, comprising not less than three persons, manages the charity. Decisions are made by the management committee by a majority of votes. In the case of an equality of votes the chairperson does not have a second or casting vote, but the matter may be referred to a general meeting of the charity.

Related parties

There were no related party transactions in the year.

Risk management

Risk assessments have been carried out to identify the following risks:-

- Lack of income
- Vehicle breakdowns
- The risk to clients getting in and out of vehicles
- The risk to clients moving between vehicles and their destination

All appropriate steps have been taken to ensure that these risks are minimised.

We continue to monitor the risk situation and to help us we are able to access advice as we are a member of the Community Transport Association (CTA).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and activities

The objects of the charity are to provide transport to the inhabitants of Arun District and its environs who have need because of age, mental of physical disability, or poverty, and in particular but not to limit the generality of the foregoing to provide and maintain non-profit community transport services.

When planning our activities for the year, the Trustees' have considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit. The organisation was formed in 1996 to provide transport for the elderly, infirm and those unable to manage public transport by means of a Social Car Scheme, minibuses or wheelchair accessible vehicles known as our Dial-A-Ride service. The charity also runs weekly shopping buses for clients that are unable to use public transport. This service offers shopping trips to three major local supermarkets on set days and routes.

From April 2013 the Charity became VAT registered, which enables us to claim our VAT back for each financial year; this has proven to be a benefit to the Charity.

Today, the charity is run and managed from its premises based on the Rudford Industrial Estate in Ford, not far from Littlehampton Town Centre and still arrange transport solutions for the local community. The service currently transports around 3,500 clients each month primarily from within the Arun area who have difficulty using public transport due to a mobility or visual disability, illness, frailty, age or other impairment. As well as conveying clients to their respective appointments and as part of ACCT's ongoing commitment to prevent social isolation and loneliness within the community, the charity also organises weekly minibus trips to local visitor attractions, restaurants and shopping centres.

Community transport continues to play a key part in the transport world, hence the dismissal of what we achieve and the reluctance to recognise the essential services we provide to our community with practical assistance.

We are now line managing 1 vehicle and we own 7 vehicles. The 7 owned vehicles includes 4 owned minibuses and 3 owned wheelchair adapted vehicles. We will also have 1 additional minibus on a two year lease agreement commencing on 8th May 2015 from the School Minibus Company who operate from Arundel.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

At 31 March 2015, the charity held reserves, excluding restricted funds and general funds represented by fixed assets for the charity's use, of £31,455. The levels of reserves that are held are to cover six month's worth of running costs and also to be available for minibus replacement, in respect of which we would hope to eventually have a 5 year replacement programme.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The Charity has sent two of the line managed vehicles back to WSCC due to the cost involved in maintaining the vehicles, in order to obtain more cost effective vehicles.

We are also working hard to raise awareness of our charity so more people can benefit from the services we offer.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

Fares income

Fares income is included in incoming resources when receivable.

Donations and grants

Income from donations and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when receivable, except when donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods in which case the income is deferred until those periods.

When donors specify that donations and grants, including capital grants, are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable.

Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, exclusive of VAT. Costs are allocated to governance costs on an actual basis, including independent examination and accountancy fees, and other costs associated with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Tangible fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £1,000 or more are capitalised at cost.

Tangible fixed assets are depreciated on a reducing balance basis over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Motor Vehicles - 25% Computer Equipment - 25%

Assets given for use by the charity are recognised as incoming resources when receivable at a reasonable estimate of their value to the charity.

Tavation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

14. RESTRICTED FUNDS

The charity's restricted funds are as follows:-

- Arundel Minibus Fund: This fund arises from grants provided for the running costs of services for the Arundel area. The grant is fully utilised in each year it is received.
- Computer and Telephone Fund: This fund arose from monies received for the purchase of computer and other equipment. Replacement computer and printing equipment was purchased during this period.
- Big Lottery Fund Grant: This fund arose from monies received from The Big Lottery Fund specifically for the purpose of purchasing a vehicle to fulfil objects of the charity and is accounted for by fixed assets on the balance sheet.
- WSCC Wellbeing Grant: This fund arose from monies granted to the charity, intended for running costs of a specific service provided by the charity. These monies have been spent in the year that they were received, in line with the restrictions place upon them.
- WSCC Wellbeing TTT Grant: This fund arose from monies granted to the charity specifically for the purpose of purchasing a vehicle to help fulfil the objects of the charity. This money is accounted for by fixed assets on the balance sheet.
- WSCC Leader Project (RPA) Grant: This fund arose from monies granted to the charity specifically for the purpose of purchasing a vehicle to help fulfil the objects of the charity. This money is accounted for by fixed assets on the balance sheet.

The assets of the restricted funds are fixed assets. The assets are in an appropriate form to enable each fund to be applied in accordance with the restrictions.

The company is under the control of the board of trustees.
