1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

Turnover

The turnover shown in the income and expenditure account represents amounts invoiced during the year

Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

Where the contractual obligations of financial instruments (including share capital) are equivalent to a similar debt instrument, those financial instruments are classed as financial liabilities Financial liabilities are presented as such in the balance sheet. Finance costs and gains or losses relating to financial liabilities are included in the profit and loss account. Finance costs are calculated so as to produce a constant rate of return on the outstanding liability.

Where the contractual terms of share capital do not have any terms meeting the definition of a financial liability then this is classed as an equity instrument. Dividends and distributions relating to equity instruments are debited direct to equity

Recognition of transactions

The company was incorporated to manage and administer the premises known as Western Beach Apartments, Silvertown, London, E16 The company receives service charges from leaseholders and tenants to cover the costs of running the property. The company holds these funds on behalf of the leaseholders on a statutory trust under s42 of the landlord and tenant act 1987 and therefore the company is not entitled to the income or assets arising from these transactions. Accordingly no transactions are recorded in these accounts.

This treatment is current best practice as advocated by the Association of Residential Managing Agents (ARMA) and supported by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Taxation

The company exists to provide a legal structure for managing the properties known as Western Beach Apartments, Silvertown The transactions relating to the service charges are not recognised in these accounts, as described elsewhere in these accounts. The company funds which fall outside the normal service charge activities, which the directors can use at their discretion. The income recorded in these accounts constitutes money received from the tenants (such as interest on late payments and rental of additional parking spaces). Any expenditure will be spent on the building for the benefit of the leaseholders, to that extent it is considered that the company does not trade for the purposes of tax and is therefore not liable to income tax.

2. COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE

The company is limited by Guarantee and has no share capital. The liability of each member is Limited to £1
