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INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF IDEALSITE LIMITED

As auditors of the company, we reported to the members on 26 February 2009 on the annual accounts prepared under section 226 of the Companies Act 1985 and taking advantage of the provisions of the Companies Act applicable to small companies for the year ended 30 April 2008 and our audit report was as follows:
