INCORPORATION

The Company was incorporated on 21st July, 2000

ACTIVITIES AND DEVELOPMENT OF BUSINESS

The Company commenced trading on 1st October, 2001, when the assets, liabilities and activities were transferred from the old Charity No 520013

Club activities during the year have included squash, snooker, pool, table tennis, table football, air hockey, short tennis, basketball, bar football, netball, volleyball, racket ball, badminton, carpet bowts, boccia, five-a-side, games console, X-box, Wil, play-station, boxercise, dance, street dance, DJ courses, art, soccer and fitness coaching, trampolining, computer studies and Duke of Edinburgh Awards. Outside activities have included football, camps and day trips. With the aid of financial support, we have also been able to run a Holiday Club during School holidays with the help of our volunteers

MANAGEMENT OF RISK

The Trustees have a programme of risk assessment and systems are in place to ensure that risks are regularly reviewed and managed. All systems are in place to prevent unauthorised access to children and to property and for the protection of children, staff and volunteers from harm or abuse.

RESERVE POLICY

We aim to hold funds to cover a year's running costs

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The past year has been another great year for the Club, with attendances beating last year's record by over 30% at over a massive 20,000 visits by members! That is nearly a hundred youths off the streets and partaking in activities every night for only 50p a night

The Astroturf pitches have given us increased capacity, extra facilities and has also enabled us to use one of the indoor gyms 4 nights a week for Trampolining, which has proved popular with our members as well as bringing new members to the Club and makes the Presentation night quite spectacular!

In the school holidays, thanks to generous funding, we have been able to open during the day with different activities and trips arranged. Unfortunately the English weather again meant that summer barbecues were limited, but the opportunity to go kayaking was a popular activity with those that were lucky enough to go

We celebrated the Jubilee weekend with a fantastic Jubilee party with over 200 people attending. The Astrotum was a hive of activity before the party moved into the indoor gym, where the youngsters had an indoor street party with food, dancing, competitions and a disconserveryone was in the party mood, and mostly in party outfits, and the tremendous decorations added to a terrific atmosphere.

We have also increased the use of the Club's facilities outside of the Youth Club hours hiring out the Club and bringing in much needed revenue. Despite this increased activity, we reduced our staffing costs so that our income covered our costs and we are grateful for the hard work that everyone has put in to enable this to happen. To look after 100 members a night requires a lot of regular volunteers to help the 1.5 staff that we employ, and I would like to thank them all for their continued time and effort.

Hopefully this will give you an idea as to how valuable the Club is to the Inner City Area of Birkenhead, how much your support is required and what value for money it provides
