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Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2010. The comparatives are for the year ended 31 December 2009.

Principal activities

The principal activity of 3sixtymedia Limited continues to be the provision of production and post production facilities. The results for the Company show a pre-tax profit of £633,000 (2009 pre tax loss £325,000) and turnover of £11,646,000 (2009 £11,984,000).

The Company has net assets of £3,146,000 (2009 £2,513,000).

Business Review

The Company had a year that pretty much reflected forecast but with some growth in Post Production activities. The results were improved as we realised some of the savings from previous efficiency reviews and we kept our focus on the control of costs.

The board mainly focused on considering the implications of the opening of MediaCityUK in Salford Quays, the first time a serious rival to our Studio business had opened in the region. In the last quarter of 2010 it was announced that ITV would relocate its Manchester base to MediaCityUK and build a bespoke production centre for Coronation Street but it was unclear exactly how this would impact 3sixtymedia as plans were in no way finalised. The directors looked at various options for the Company but ultimately decided to maintain 'business as usual' until greater clarity was gained regarding the move. The situation would be under review in 2011.

Key Performance Indicators

The directors regularly monitor the following key performance indicators to track the performance of the business

Across the 3 main studios, a total utilisation of 317 days (35%) was achieved in 2010, compared to a utilisation in 2009 of 348 days (37%) Full utilisation (or 100%) is represented by studio bookings all six days per week (ie excluding Sundays) for 52 weeks per annum

The key financial indicators monitored are net profit by business area (ie studios & crews, post production and storage and central overheads). In 2010 the studios & crews area of the business showed a year on year increase, with a net profit of £951k (2009 £843k). Post production showed a year on year increase, with a net profit of £1,179k (2009 £627k). Other areas including storage and central overhead costs recorded a net loss of £1,498k (2009 loss of £1,794k). The decrease in central overhead costs year on year is a direct result of the cost savings now delivered as a result of the 2010 business review.

Future Outlook and Principal Risks

MediaCityUK has had some impact on the Company's business already with the loss of BBC productions and the potential to also lose some third party production. Discussions with the Peel Group (the owners of MediaCityUK) continued throughout 2011 but our focus will be on sustaining a suitable model until decisions are made on the business going forward

The Company is a participating employer in both ITV and BBC defined benefit schemes. There is a risk that the Company may cease to be a participating employer in one or both schemes in the future due to staff leaving and as a result the Company may incur additional pension liabilities

Dividends

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2009: £nil)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Company's financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules

Going concern

The Company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development and position, are set out in the Business review section of the Directors' report on pages 2 to 3

The Company does not own a bank account. Cash receipts and payments are accounted for on the Company's behalf by fellow group undertakings and are reflected in the movement in amounts owed to/from group undertakings

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, which the directors believe to be appropriate for the following reason. The Company is dependent for its working capital on funds provided to it by ITV Studios Limited, the Company's immediate parent undertaking. ITV plc, the Company's ultimate parent undertaking has provided the Company with an undertaking that for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements. It will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the Company and, in particular, will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available. This should enable the Company to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future by meeting its liabilities as they fall due for payment. As with any company placing reliance on other group entities for financial support, the directors acknowledge that there can be no certainty that this support will continue, although at the date of approval of these financial statements they have no reason to believe that it will not do so

On this basis, and on their assessment of the Company's financial position, the Company's directors have a reasonable expectation that the company will be able to continue in existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Turnover

Turnover, which arises wholly in the United Kingdom, represents the invoiced amounts for services provided during the year and is stated net of Value Added Tax. Revenue is recognised when the services are provided

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives as follows:

Vehicles, equipment and fittings 3 to 8 years

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is more likely than not that the asset will be recovered

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

Post-retirement benefits

Defined Contribution Scheme

Total contributions recognised in the profit and loss account in relation to defined contribution schemes during 2010 were £43,678 (2009 £30,924)

Defined Benefit Scheme

The Company is a participating member of the ITV defined benefit pension scheme. The scheme's assets are held in separate trustee administered funds. Contributions are based on pension costs across the group as a whole

The Company is unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the scheme on a consistent and reasonable basis. Therefore, as permitted by FRS 17 'Retirement benefits' the Company has accounted for contributions to the scheme as if it were a defined contribution scheme.

The ITV plc Group's main scheme, formed by merger on 31 January 2006, consists of three sections, A, B and C The first triennial valuation of section A was completed at 1 January 2008 by an independent actuary for the Trustees of the ITV Pension Scheme. The first triennial valuations of sections B and C were completed as at 1 January 2007 and the next triennial valuation of these sections are being undertaken as at 1 January 2010. The Group will monitor funding levels annually. The latest actuarial valuations have been updated for FRS 17 purposes to 31 December 2009 by a qualified independent actuary.

The Company's normal contributions for the year were £421,850 (2009 £491,266). In addition to normal funding the ITV plc Group made a further contribution of £30 million in the year (2009 £30 million). The levels of contributions are based on the current service costs and the expected future cash flows of the defined benefit scheme.

At 31 December 2010 the scheme had an FRS 17 deficit of £313 million (2009 £436 million).

Particulars of the actuanal valuations of the Group schemes are contained in the financial statements of ITV plc which can be obtained from the address given in note 16

As well as the above contributions, a contribution of £86,315 (2009 £99,000) has been made to the BBC pensions scheme which has been treated similarly to the above Details of this scheme can be found in the financial statements of the BBC Pensions Scheme, which can be obtained from BBC Pension Trust Limited, Broadcasting House, London WA1 1AA
