1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom which have been applied consistently throughout the current and prior year. The financial statements are made up to the nearest Saturday to 31 January, so as to coincide with its ultimate holding company. The current financial year is the 52 weeks ended 31 January 2015. The comparative financial year is for the 52 weeks ended 1 February 2014.

The Company's ultimate holding company is Kingfisher plc and the cash flows of the Company are shown in the consolidated financial statements of Kingfisher plc, which are publicly available. Consequently the Company is exempt under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 1 (revised) from publishing a cash flow statement.

The Company is exempt under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from publishing consolidated financial statements as it is included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of its ultimate parent, Kingfisher plc which is registered in England and Wales.

The Company is also exempt under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 8 from disclosing related party transactions with entities wholly owned within the Group.

The directors' consideration of going concern is set out in the directors' report on page 3.

Interest receivable and payable

Interest receivable and payable is accrued on a daily basis.

Taxation

The income tax expense represents the sum of tax currently payable. Current tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

The tax currently payable is based on the taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from profit before taxation as reported in the profit and loss account because it excludes items of income or expense which are taxable or deductible in other years or which are never taxable or deductible.

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments are included in the balance sheet at cost, less any provisions for impairment.
