Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and financial statements for the 52 weeks ended 30 July 2016.

This directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies entitled to the small companies' exemption and no strategic report has been presented in line with these provisions.

Business overview and principal activities

2 Sisters Premier Division Limited ('the Company') is a wholly owned subsidiary of the group headed by Boparan Holdings Limited ("the Group").

The Company did not trade during the period. It is anticipated that the Company will remain dormant for the foreseeable future.

Auditor

For the period ended 30 July 2016 the Company is entitled to exemption from audit under section 480 of the Companies Act 2006 relating to dormant companies. The members have not required the company to obtain an audit of its accounts for the period in question in accordance with section 476.

Adoption of Financial Reporting Standard 102

This is the first year that the Company has presented its financial statements under Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS102) issued by the Financial Reporting Council. The Company's accounting policies under FRS 102 are not materially different to those under previous UK GAAP. Consequently the transition to FRS 102 has had no impact on the Company's equity for the comparative period, and the amounts recognised under FRS 102 are equal to the figures reported under previous UK GAAP.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

2 Sisters Premier Division Limited is a company incorporated in the United Kingdom under the Companies Act. The Company is a private company limited by shares and is registered in England and Wales. The address of the Company's registered office is shown on page 1 and the nature of the Company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the directors' report.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies subject to the small companies' regime, and in accordance with section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS102) issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

These financial statements are the first financial statements prepared under FRS 102. The Company's last financial statements for the period ended 1 August 2015 (the comparative period) were prepared under previous UK GAAP. Therefore the date of transition to FRS 102 was 3 August 2014. Adopting FRS 102 has had no impact on the Company's equity for the comparative period, and the amounts recognised under FRS 102 are equal to the figures reported under previous UK GAAP, therefore no separate transition note is presented.

The functional currency of the Company is considered to be pounds sterling, because that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates. These financial statements are also presented in pounds sterling.

Going concern

The Company currently has no external debt and is in a net liabilities position. The parent company has confirmed that it is the current intention to provide sufficient financial support, should it be required, to enable the Company to meet its liabilities as they fall due for a period of not less than 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements.

The directors have considered the future activities of the Company and have concluded that the Company is a going concern. The financial statements have therefore been prepared on a going concern basis.

Financial instruments

All amounts due from, or owed to Group undertakings are repayable on demand and held at amortised cost.

Equity instruments

Equity instruments issued by the Company are recorded at the fair value of cash or other resources received, net of direct issue costs.

Group financial statements

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing consolidated accounts afforded by section 400 of the Companies Act 2006, because it is a wholly owned indirect subsidiary of Boparan Holdings Limited which is the smallest group of undertakings which prepare publicly available consolidated accounts that incorporate the results of the Company. Therefore these financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The directors have assessed that there are no critical accounting judgements or sources of estimation uncertainty in these financial statements.

The parent company of the largest group of undertakings for which group financial statements are drawn up and of which the Company is a member is Boparan Holdco Limited, registered in England and Wales.
