STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Alnwick International Music Festival is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee as defined by the Companies Act 2006. Under the memorandum and articles of association with which the organisation is governed, the charity has the power to make any investment which the trustees see fit.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are appointed by existing trustees who serve throughout the year. The trustees meet monthly and a treasurer is appointed by the trustees to handle the day-to-day finances of the charity.

Reserves policy and risk management

The trustees monitor the progress of the organisation when they meet at their regular management committee meetings. The trustees are aware of the risk that obtaining funding, although usually successful, may not be achieved at the beginning of each financial year. The trustees forecast the level of free reserves to safeguard against this. The trustees aim to have two thirds of the annual running costs of reserves (i.e. £20,000) built up to enable the organisation to sustain stability, and recommend a fundraising strategy to increase the free reserves to this level.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2016

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The organisation's objectives are to promote and advance the education of the public generally in the study and practice of the arts of music, poetry, acting, dancing, literature and similar arts in all their branches and the cultivation of public appreciation of those arts, in particular by means of presenting an annual music festival in Alnwick.

In setting our objectives and planning our activities the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

Public benefit

The trustees have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's purposes for the public benefit and in planning future activities.

STRATEGIC REPORT

Achievement and performance

Charitable activities

The 41st Alnwick International Music Festival saw a slight change in direction following a number of meetings with the Trustees and a planning committee. Lack of availability of accommodation for international groups necessitated change and meant that we welcomed a large number of UK performers and International groups based in the UK. The Japanese drummers and Ukrainian dancers being firm favourites with the audience.

The audience gave a warm welcome to all the performers and the festival was a success with a wide variety of talents and musical styles on display each day. As always, the free to watch Market place concerts were well supported. The development of the evening programme showed some success especially with the Jazz and blues evening. The introduction of the spoken word element was welcomed by some and the poetry and music evening saw engagement with a different audience.

The festival workshops were varied and attendance was in line with previous years. The family ceilidh was a firm favourite with families and enjoying letting off steam to wonderful music provided by Simply Northumbrian. The Maypole session was offered free to all participants and moved from the hall to the stage to show an audience what had been achieved in an hour's session. The washboard session and the ukulele workshop were also popular with adults as well as children and again both showcased on the main stage.

Audience numbers were very good throughout the week and perennial favourites Rythmstix involved the full market place audience in their performance. The Town Council sponsored an evening in the Northumberland Hall to thank volunteers from this and previous festivals.

The main stage was shared by performers of all ages and was scheduled to maximise potential audience and allow the teens and new performers to experience performing to a live audience. A number of volunteers including a good number of young people assisted both during the set up and the delivery of the actual festival. Due to the lack of resident groups the variety of the daily performances was improved with no two days being the same line-up. This increased visitor frequency to the event. Feedback shared both positive and negative views with people requesting more dance groups and commending the festival for the increased evening events.

Plans for future developments

Following audience feedback about the 41st festival we will look to increase the variety of international groups and continue to develop involvement / participation of all members of the community both resident and visitor in the festival as a whole. To reach a compromise accommodation for International groups will be sought and we will develop links with further dance groups and UK resident groups to bring an international flavour.

We will also further engage with the community of Alnwick and its surroundings, offering performance opportunities and activities to be involved in including a further enrichment of the evening programme.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF ALNWICK INTERNATIONAL MUSIC FESTIVAL

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Equipment

- 20% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
