REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The directors present their annual report and accounts of the company for the year ended 30 June 2008.

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company in the period under review was the creation, supply, licensing, development and maintenance of software and systems together with research relating to software and systems in the UK and the rest of the world.

Parent company

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Agent Oriented Software Pty Ltd., a company incorporated in Australia.

At 30th June 2007 and 30th June 2008 Dr. Andrew Lucas's interest in the shares of the parent company was 526,333 Ordinary shares of \$1 each and 1,935,417 Ordinary shares of \$0.05 each.

Subsequent to the year end he acquired a further 139,613 Ordinary shares of \$1.00 each and then, as part of a rights issue, he subscribed for a further 20,000,000 shares of \$0.01 each. Accordingly his current holding is 665,946 Ordinary shares of \$1 each, 1,935,417 shares of \$0.05 each and 20,000,000 shares of \$.01.

Directors' responsibilities

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS 30 JUNE 2008

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities.

Cash flow

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1 Cash Flow Statements.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods and services, excluding VAT.

In the case of long term contracts, turnover reflects the contract activity during the year.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment.

Depreciation is calculated to write down the cost or valuation less estimated residual value of all tangible fixed assets by equal annual instalments over their estimated useful economic lives. The periods generally applicable are:

Computer equipment

over 3 years

Long-term contracts

The attributable profit on long-term contracts is recognized once their outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty. The profit recognized reflects the proportion of work completed to date on the project.

Costs associated with long-term contracts are included in stock to the extent that they cannot be matched with contract work accounted for as turnover. Long-term contract balances included in stocks are stated at cost, after provision has been made for any foreseeable losses and the deduction of payments on account.

Full provision is made for losses on all contracts in the year in which the loss is first foreseen.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax arises as a result of including items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the company's accounts. Deferred tax is provided in full on timing differences which result in an obligation to pay more (or less) tax at a future date, at the average tax rates that are expected to apply when the timing differences reverse, based on current tax rates and laws.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Research and development

Expenditure on research and development is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction.

2 Turnover
