Directors' responsibilities

The Group operates in two principal business areas for exploitation of the Group's patented technology, architectural glazing (SerraGlaze ®) and automotive vision (Serraview A Pillar System and Serraview Prismatic Mirror System - Milner Mirror).

Business review

Fair review of the business

The results for the year and financial position of the company and of the group are as shown in the annexed financial statements

As previously reported, the Board has focussed on achieving commercial viability for its patented Architectural Glazing technology known as SerraGlaze ® The Board formed the view that the necessary capital and industry resources should be sought in the United States of America. The manufacturing technology to produce SerraGlaze ® economically as large scale film products has been identified along with access to a substantial market.

SerraSolar Inc was therefore established as a US corporation based in San Jose, California in May 2010 in conjunction with others resident in California. The directors and founding shareholders of SerraSolar Inc are David Willetts and Robert Blair and the latter was also appointed a director of this Company. At the same time, the Company entered into a binding memorandum of understanding, whereby, the intellectual property of SerraGlaze. Is to be transferred to SerraSolar Inc in return for equity when an agreed level of funding is achieved. Meanwhile, in September 2011, following a reorganisation of its share capital, SerraSolar Limited, the Company's subsidiary has raised interim equity funding of US 1 million to continue with the commercial development of SerraGlaze.

Over the ensuing months, SerraSolar Inc has assembled an experienced team in California with the requisite technical, manufacturing, marketing and sales skills to implement this strategy. Further, in December 2010, the Board appointed a boutique investment bank based in California with a UK office in London to advise and assist in securing the capital required from a major corporate industrial investor. Subsequent to the year end the Company has engaged with its Advisors in a marketing programme with substantive discussions currently in train with major US based companies.

The Company has been financed during this period by loans provided by three shareholders, two of whom are directors. At 31 December 2010, the Company's obligations to these lenders amounted to £475,000 Notwithstanding the progress made towards achieving commercial viability for SerraGlaze ®, there is no prospect of realisations from the disposal of the Company's automotive technologies in the foreseeable future Accordingly the decision has been made to reduce the book value of the Company's automotive technology to a nominal amount. The reduction is shown as an exceptional item in the profit and loss account for the year.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities (effective April 2008)

Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of the company and its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 31 December 2010

Subsidiary undertakings are included using the acquisitions method of accounting. Under this method the group profit and loss account includes the results of subsidiaries from the date of acquisition and to the date of sale outside the group in the case of disposals of subsidiaries. The purchase consideration has been allocated to the assets and liabilities on the basis of fair value at the date of acquisition.

No profit and loss account is presented for the company as permitted by Section 408 of the Companies Act 2006. Its loss for the financial year was £546,822 (2009 - £10,574)

Exemption from preparing a cash flow statement

The group has taken advantage of the exceptions under the FRSSE not to prepare a cashflow statement

Related party transactions

The group has taken advantage of the exceptions under the FRSSE, Related Party Disclosures, not to disclose transactions with wholly owned companies in the same group

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis

In September 2011, following a reorganisation of its share capital and intercompany indebtedness, SerraSolar Limited raised equity funding of US\$ 1 million to continue with the commercial development of SerraGlaze ®

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services provided in the normal course of business, net of trade discounts, VAT and other sales related taxes. In the opinion of the directors there is only one class of business, and therefore analysis by class is not required. In addition, all turnover is derived from the UK. The turnover and loss before taxation are attributable to the principal activities of the group.

Intangible assets

Intangible assets goodwill, investments, patents and know-how are classified generically as Intellectual Property. The net book values of certain associated tangible fixed and current assets, primarily demonstration equipment and materials, are also classified as Intellectual Property.

Intellectual Property is stated at historic cost less amount provided to reduce cost to estimated net realisable value. Historic cost comprises directly related expenditure incurred by the company and its wholly owned subsidiary on patents, research and development of technology systems, processes and products. No depreciation or amortisation has been charged.

The Debenture Loan represents monies advanced by the executive director to provide financial support to the Group. The debenture deed dated 8 May 2008 secures all monies advanced by the debenture holder by a fixed and floating charge over all of the assets of the company including intellectual property and the whole of the share capital of the Company's subsidiary. The loan bears interest on a day-to-day basis at the rate of 5% per annum above LIBOR.

Shareholder loans represent monies advanced by three shareholders, two of whom are directors. The terms of the Shareholder Loans are that there is no fixed repayment, the loans are non interest bearing and that the loans will be repaid first, at a premium of 100%, in priority to the Debenture Loan and the unsecured creditors from net amounts received from realisations of intellectual property owned by the Group
